### Attendance

For the month of March our student attendance was 72.60 % overall. Below is a break down by grade level.

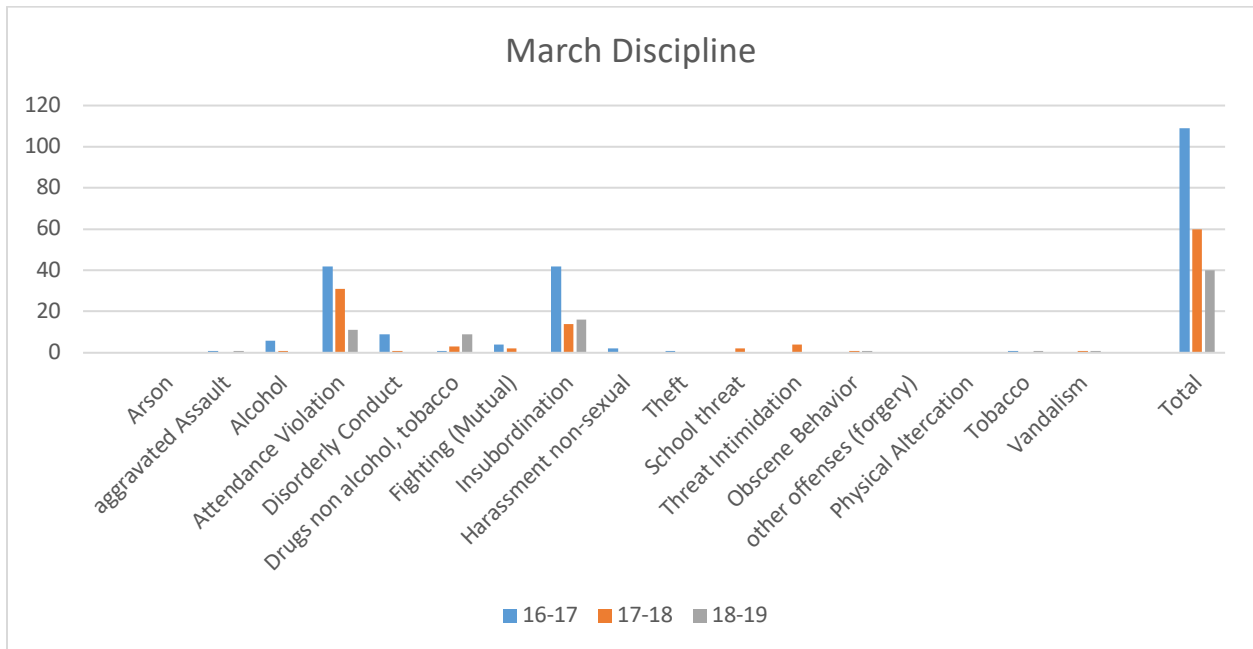
### Discipline

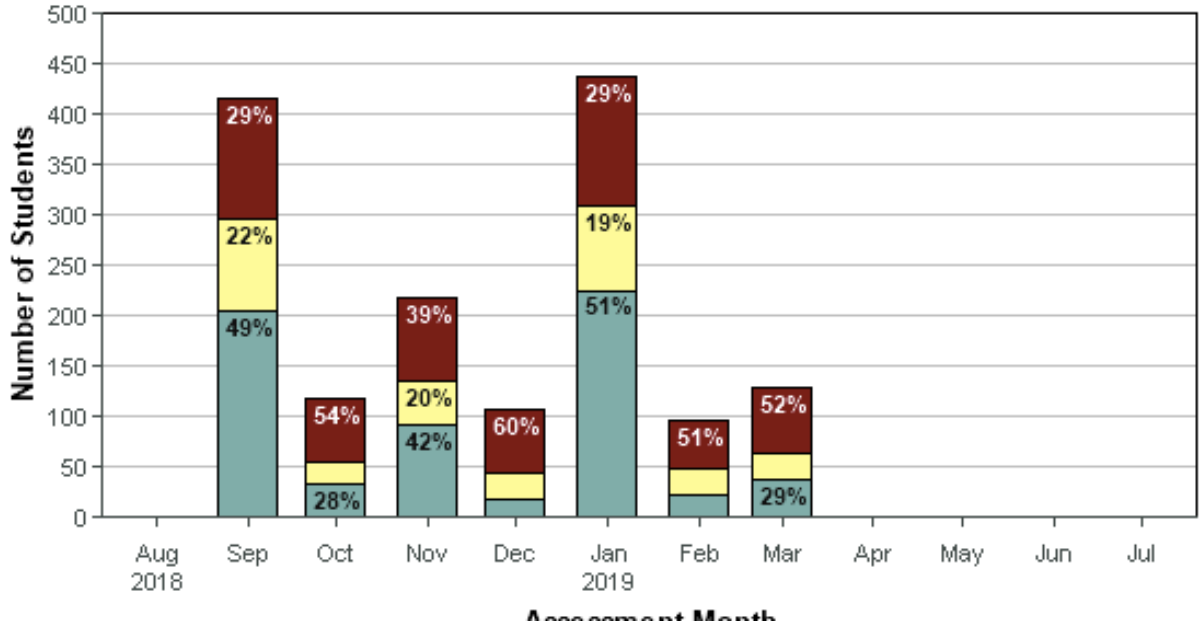
## Academic

### Data

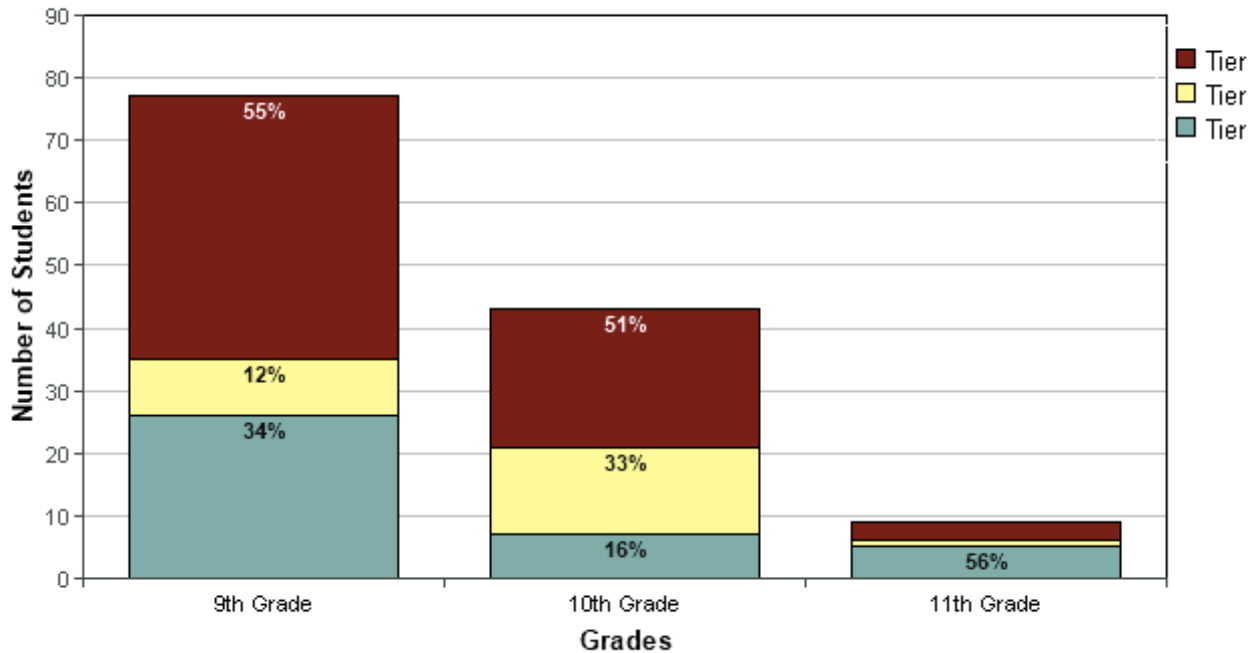
