Background Information:

- The Tarrant County Extension staff works with twenty community clubs in Tarrant County, including the Keller 4-H club, to grow confident, capable, and caring kids with the life skills to thrive in today's world and succeed in their dreams for tomorrow.
- The Keller 4-H club is open to Keller ISD students and all students in Tarrant County. Texas Administrative code (TAC) §129.21(j) allows public school students to be considered "in attendance" when participating in off-campus activities with an adjunct staff member of the school district.

Administrative Considerations:

- Tarrant County 4-H Organization is approved for recognition and eligible for extracurricular status consideration under TAC §76.1001, pertaining to extracurricular activities.
- Approval of agreement allows students who participate in off-campus activities with the 4-H organization and with an adjunct staff member to be considered "in attendance" for Keller ISD attendance accounting purposes.
