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INTRODUCTION

At The Opportunity Academy, we:

Eligible Students (Texas Education Code (TEC) §29.0822)

- The student is at risk of dropping out of school (TEC, §29.081); or
- The student, as a result of attendance requirements (TEC, §25.092), will be denied credit for one or more classes in which the student has been enrolled;
- The student is attending a school with an approved early college high school program designation; or
- The student is attending an academically unacceptable campus implementing a campus turnaround plan approved by the commissioner (TEC 39A Subchapter C); or
- The student is attending a community-based dropout recovery education program [TEC, §29.081 (e-1) or(e-2)]. and
- The student, if less than 18 years of age and not emancipated by marriage or court order, and the student's parent, or person standing in parental relation to the student, agree in writing to the student's participation.

Primary Goals of TOA

What is The Opportunity Academy?

- ❑ It is a computer-based instruction (CBI) lab that provides students with options and resources to obtain high school credit.
- ❑ It is a curriculum program (Edmentum / PLATO Learning Online) that has been aligned to state and national learning standards.
- ❑ Personalized educational experience to build around each student's individual needs and graduation requirements.

Purpose of TOA

- ❑ TOA serves our community students with a credit recovery program.
- ❑ Through this alternative instructional model, students will be provided a flexible schedule to work independently to earn high school credits, prepare for state exams, and graduate.
- ❑ TOA provides education equally to all students.

Benefits of TOA

- ❑ Students get to participate in Canutillo High School's graduation ceremony the year they complete their courses and pass all EOC/STAAR assessments.
- ❑ There is a flexible schedule that work around student's busy life.
- ❑ Students work at their own pace.
- ❑ Small class size.
- ❑ Very friendly and helpful staff.
- ❑ Offer summer school in all subject areas.

CONCLUSION

- **Course offerings have expanded aggressively, especially between 2022 and 2026.**
- **The percentage of graduates based on TOA enrollment has increased from 35% to 44% to 53% respectively in the last three school years.**
- **There is a significant increase of TOA students that require more courses to complete to meet graduation requirements. The more courses that need to be completed, the more time a student spends in TOA.**
- **Graduation numbers remain fairly consistent, suggesting academic performance and retention are stable despite fluctuations in enrollment and IGCs.**
