ACADEMICS

- The school year has been off to a great start! During the first 5 days of school, the students had advisory sessions. The sessions included a session with me to go over expectations and procedures, a counselor session to go over graduation and capstone requirements, a session with CPAC to go over the mentor program with sophomores, and skills-based sessions that focused on note-taking, time management, goal setting, post-graduation plans, organization, and communication.

CPAC

Each student will have a REAL ME workbook for guiding activities during CPAC days.
