Subject: 2026 Accountability Ratings, Improvement Plans, House Bill 3, and Targeted Support and Improvement

Background Information

Accountability

Dr. Odajima will present the District and Campus A-F Accountability Ratings for the 2025-2026 school year, released by TEA on August 14, 2026. Tonight's presentation will provide collective data for all campuses and the district as a whole. The accountability system evaluates districts and campuses across three key domains:

Domain 1: Student Achievement – measuring academic success.

Domain 2: School Progress – tracking improvement over time.

Domain 3: Closing the Gaps – focusing on equity support for specific student groups.

Each campus and the district receives a letter grade based on the combined outcome of these domains. 70% reflecting the better outcome between Student Achievement and School Progress, and 30% based on federally identified performance targets for specific student groups. This design ensures that strong student achievement is recognized, while also focusing on students who need the most support. Tonight's presentation will highlight Midway's areas of excellence and areas for growth, review local school comparison data, and discuss performance targets for the upcoming school year.

Improvement Plans and House Bill 3 Academic Targets

Building on this accountability data, the district and each campus continuously review, rate, and revise progress on their improvement plans to strengthen student performance each year. The planning process is guided by advisory committees at both the campus and district levels, including teachers, staff, district administrators, parents, business representatives, and community members, and is conducted in accordance with Board Policy and Texas state statute using the format required by TEA.

The District Improvement Plan is organized around four goals, Academics, Culture, Leadership and Advocacy, reflecting the district's shift toward a more student-centered focus. Goal 1, Academics, includes the House Bill 3 Early Childhood literacy, math, and College, Career, and Military Readiness goal requirements as well as strategies that pertain to House Bill 4545/HB1416. The MAST committee will continue to examine progress toward each goal throughout the school year and recommend ongoing improvement. The campus and district improvement plans are included on tonight's consent agenda for Board approval.

Targeted Support and Improvement

Within the broader improvement planning process, one campus requires additional attention. Midway Middle School has been identified under the state's yearly accountability system as a campus for Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI). This designation is assigned by TEA when a campus has one or more student groups that fail to meet interim targets or expected growth on the same three indicators for three consecutive years, indicating consistent underperformance. As a result, the campus is required to develop a Local Improvement Plan (LIP) that includes an

evidence-based school improvement strategy designed to improve student outcomes and remove the campus from TSI status. The plan must also include: a description of how district and campus leaders will monitor implementation; additional actions the district will take if the plan is not successfully implemented; a description of the reallocation of resources—time, funding, and staffing—needed to carry out the improvement strategy; and specific student performance goals. State guidance requires that LIPs be developed, board-approved, and in the process of implementation by November 20, 2026; however, the Campus Improvement Plan (CIP) may satisfy the LIP requirement provided it meets all guidance criteria. For Midway Middle School, these requirements are embedded in the CIP under Goal 1, Objective 3, Strategies 1–8, and are presented for board approval as part of the consent agenda.
