School Health Advisory Council (SHAC)

Every independent school district is required by law to have a school health advisory council (SHAC) of which the majority of members must be parents who are not employed by the school district.

Texas Education Code Title 2, Chapter 28, Section 28.004

What is a SHAC?

The SHAC is a group of individuals representing segments of the community and school district which provides advice to the district on coordinated school health (CSH) programming and its impact on student health and learning.



Coordinated School Health Consists of 8 Key Components

Eight Components

- Health Education
- Healthy and Safe School Environment
- Counseling and Mental Health Services
- Parent and Community Involvement
- Staff Wellness Promotion
- Health Services
- Physical Education
- Nutrition Services



State Legislated SHAC Requirements

Texas Education Code, Chapter 28, Section 28.004:

- ✓ A parent must serve as a co-chair
- ✓ A minimum of five members must be appointed to serve on the SHAC by Board of Trustees
- ✓ Majority of members must be parents who are not employees of the district
- ✓ SHAC must meet at least 4 times a year
- ✓ All meetings must be recorded and 3 business days notice must be given and the agenda must be posted prior to the meeting
- ✓ The minutes and recording are posted on the website.
- ✓ SHAC must deliver an annual report to the Board of Trustees

Accomplishments



- St. David's Dental Program provided dental treatments at 7 of the 9 title I campuses (BME, BTE, DES, LES, PCE, PME) All of these campuses received \$1000 checks for all their hard work and collaboration for the dental clinics.

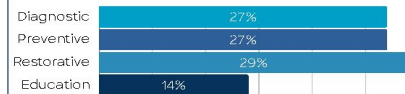

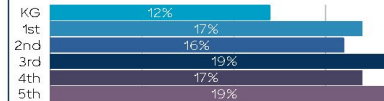
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Services Provided by Treatment Category

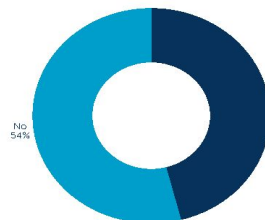


Patients Treated by Grade

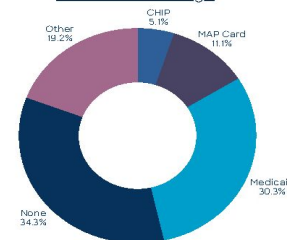

St. Davids Foundation Dental Program and Elementary - Impact Summary

Our program provided **free, on-campus restorative, preventive, and educational dental services** to 1,122 students from seven Title I schools in Manor Independent School District, **removing barriers such as cost, transportation, and time away from class. Each child received an average of \$1,711 in dental care**, helping families save money that could instead be used for essentials like rent, food, and utilities. The impact of our services extends beyond individual students. **Healthier smiles support better attendance, increased confidence, and improved readiness to learn, strengthening the school community as a whole.**



Accomplishments

Whole Child Department

- Mental Health Services were provided through various Partnerships in the district - these services were based on individual student needs.
25th annual resource fair
Welcomed an estimated **2,120 attendees**
Packed **2,336 backpacks** filled with school supplies
Hosted **78 amazing vendors** out of the 86 who registered

Food and Nutrition Department

All Schools Meals were free for the 2025-26
Wellness Plan reviewed and recommendations were presented for revisions.

Employee Wellness

- Aurora Concepts administered vaccines for staff during the year that ranged from Tdap to Shingles vaccines.



Student Support Services Provided

Pregnancy Related Services 25-26

- Pregnant Teens: **11** (2 graduated, 3 withdrew/transferred/unenrolled)
- Parent Teens: **13** (1 graduated, 1 withdrew/transferred/unenrolled)
- Parenting Classes/Support Group through Project Gabriel

Project Hope

- Support for 310 students district-wide includes assistance with transportation, enrollment, basic needs assistance, advocacy, one on one with students as needed, progress monitoring and referrals to community resources within the district and community.



Recommendations

- To recruit a student representative from each high school to serve as the student representatives at the SHAC meetings.
- Recruit more parents and community stakeholders for the committee to be consistent with more parents than staff.
- Create a focus group to use the Honor Cord Tool Kit and implement an honor cord for graduating seniors to earn for participating in various health and wellness activities that encompasses the Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child Model (WSCC Model)

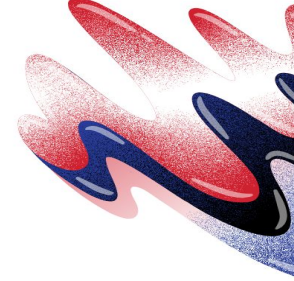


PROMOTING HEALTH AND WELLNESS FOR STUDENTS

A School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) is a group of parents and community members, appointed by the school board to serve at the district level. Members of the SHAC come from different areas of the community and from within the school district.

The majority of members must be parents who are not employed by the district. Texas law requires the establishment of a SHAC for every school district. SHACs are required to meet at least four times each year.

- **Better Choices:** SHACs help to create a new generation of thriving Texans by provided parent, community, and most importantly student input.
