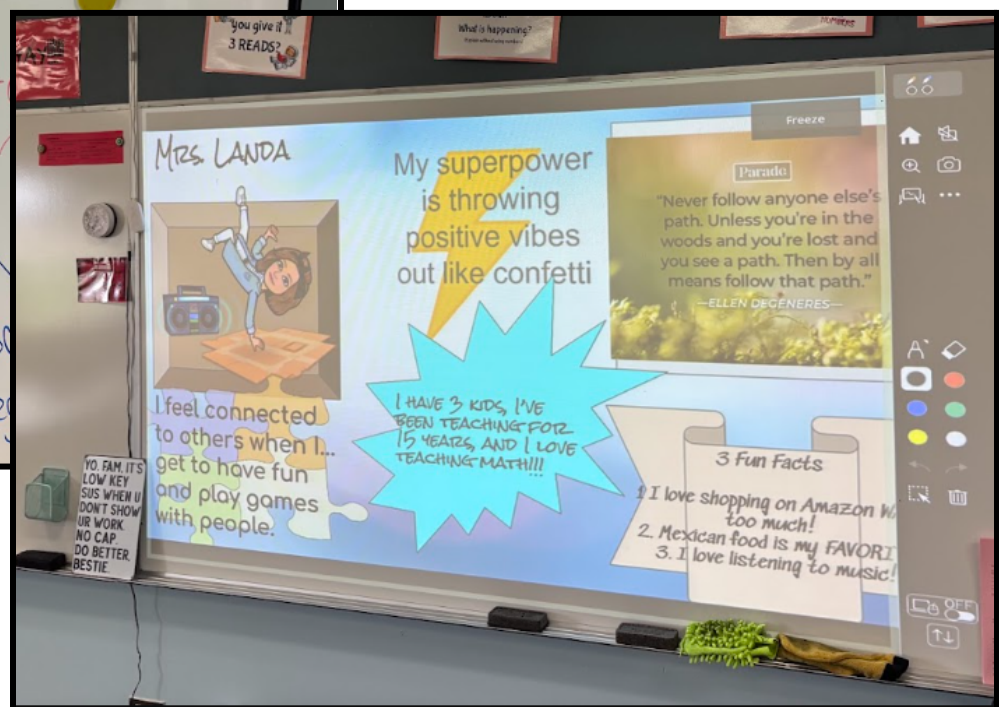
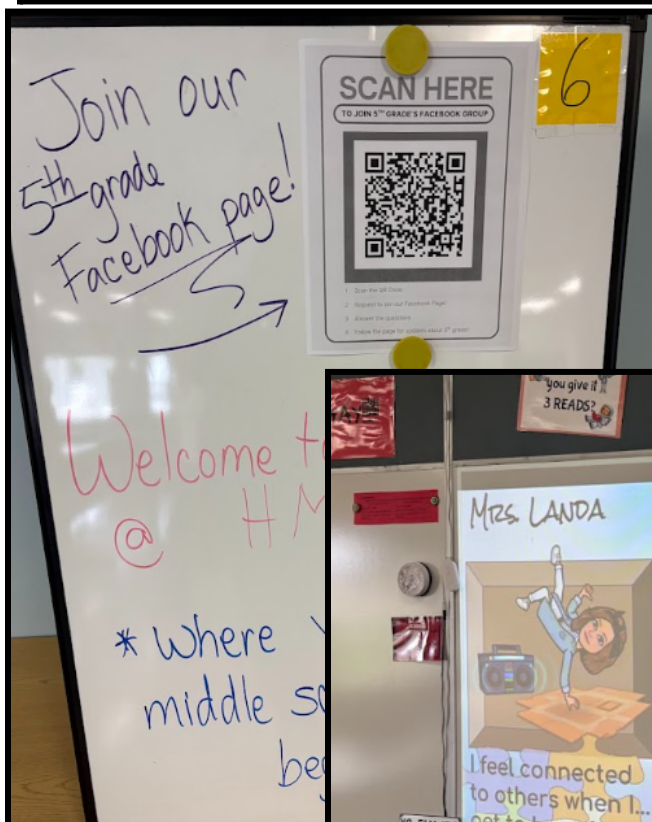
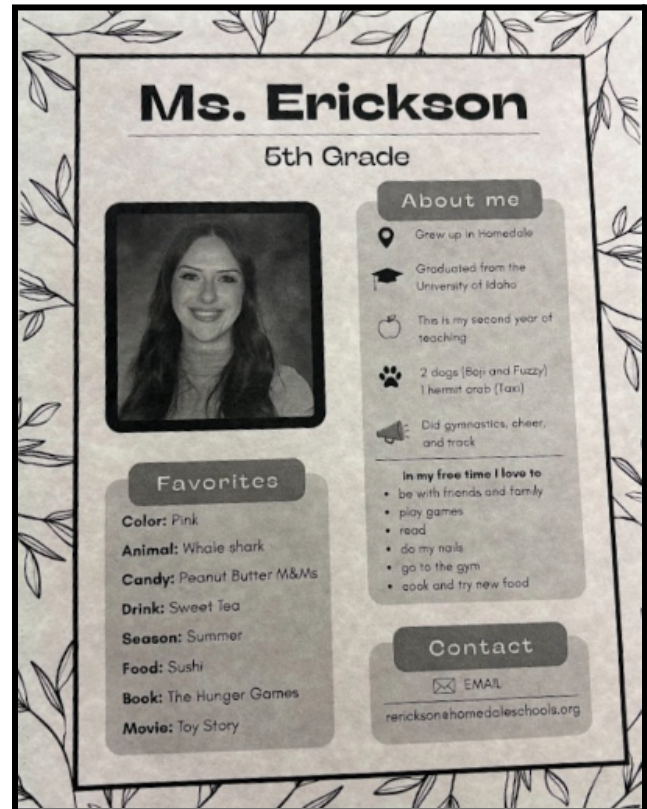
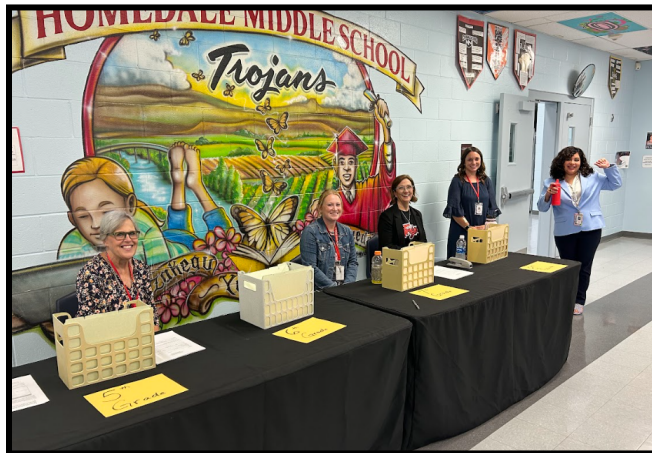
National Junior Honor Society
