SUBJECT: State Accountability Report

BOARD POLICY: AIB (Legal)

DISTRICT GOAL: Brazosport ISD will exercise fiscal responsibility to ensure financial strength and provide the resources to equip and maintain quality facilities and educational programming.

FISCAL NOTE: N/A

Background Information:

- The Texas Education Agency assigns performance ratings of A-F each year to each district and campus based on STAAR and STAAR EOC performance, student attainment of College, Career, and Military Readiness standards, and graduation rates.
- A-F Ratings are assigned for three Domains, with two grades assigned to Domain II.
 - Domain I - Student Achievement
 - Domain II - School Progress
 - II A - Academic Growth
 - II B - Relative Performance
 - Domain III - Closing the Gaps
- The Federal Department of Education uses Domain III - Closing the Gaps to determine Federal Accountability for campuses.
- The district and all general education campuses are eligible to earn Distributions in:
 - Academic Achievement in Reading/Language Arts,
 - Academic Achievement in Mathematics,
 - Academic Achievement in Science,
 - Academic Achievement in Social Studies,
 - Top 25%: Comparative Academic Growth,
 - Postsecondary Readiness, and
 - Top 25%: Comparative Closing the Gaps
- Campuses can be identified for school improvement under both state and federal accountability as:
 - Comprehensive Support and Improvement,
 - Targeted Support and Improvement, and

- Additional Targeted Support and Improvement

Administrative Considerations:

- The district earned an overall rating of "B", with a score of 83, and is considered a Recognized District.
- Three district campuses earned "A" ratings and are considered Exemplary campuses.
- Six district campuses earned "B" ratings and are considered Recognized campuses.
- Four district campuses earned "C" ratings and are considered Acceptable campuses.
- One district campus earned a "D" rating and is considered a Needs Improvement Campus
- One district campus earned an "F" rating and is considered an Unacceptable campus. That campus was S.F. Austin, and it is now closed. No sanctions were assigned to the campus because last year the campus earned a "B" rating. However, we are awaiting guidance from the state concerning monitoring the performance of former SFA students this year and reporting on their progress.
- Ten district campuses earned a total of 26 Distinctions
- Lighthouse Learning Center is no longer identified for school improvement
- Clute Intermediate School improved from an Additional Targeted Support campus to a Targeted Support and Improvement Campus.
- Freeport Intermediate School improved from a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI): Identified campus to a CSI: Progress campus, meaning if they continue to improve, they will no longer be identified as CSI.
