Participation in the New Mexico FFA Welding Series supports Aztec High School's focus on student engagement, academic growth, career readiness, and the application of classroom learning to real-world situations. The contest is designed to simulate working conditions found on construction and metal fabrication job sites, providing students an opportunity to demonstrate skills learned through Agricultural Education and Agricultural Mechanics.

Students will apply classroom learning in welding, metal fabrication, measurement, tool and equipment use, workplace safety, problem-solving, and project completion. The competition also requires students to communicate effectively, work as a team, manage their time, follow detailed instructions, and maintain safe working practices while completing assigned tasks.

This experience strengthens Career and Technical Education learning by moving students beyond practicing individual skills in the classroom and requiring them to apply those skills in a structured, career-based environment. Students will also have the opportunity to observe the quality and techniques demonstrated by students from other agricultural education programs and identify areas in which they can continue improving their own skills.

Participation will help students build technical ability, confidence, teamwork, communication, and employability skills that can transfer directly to future Agricultural Mechanics coursework, industry certifications, postsecondary training, and careers in welding, construction, fabrication, agriculture, and the skilled trades.

Transportation shall be provided only by District vehicles, driven by authorized personnel.

The District will not sponsor, approve, support, or encourage field trips that do not meet the criteria outlined in this policy, unless the Board gives approval after a presentation justifying the specific need for the exception.
