Aztec FFA is requesting to travel to Tularosa High School in Tularosa, New Mexico, to participate in the New Mexico FFA Welding Series. Participation supports Aztec High School's focus on student engagement, academic growth, career readiness, and applying classroom learning in real-world situations. The contest is designed to simulate working conditions found on construction and metal fabrication job sites, allowing students to demonstrate skills learned through Agricultural Education and Agricultural Mechanics.

Students will apply skills in welding, metal fabrication, measurement, tool and equipment use, workplace safety, problem-solving, and project completion. Working as a team also requires students to communicate effectively, manage their time, follow detailed instructions, make decisions, and maintain safe working practices under competitive conditions.

Traveling to Tularosa provides students the opportunity to compete alongside Agricultural Education and welding programs from other areas of New Mexico. Students can observe different techniques and workmanship, receive feedback, and identify areas for continued improvement.

This experience strengthens students' technical abilities while developing teamwork, communication, confidence, and employability skills that can transfer to future coursework, postsecondary training, industry certifications, and careers in welding, construction, fabrication, agriculture, and the skilled trades.
