- I am excited to share that our admin team applied again this year for the T-Mobile 5G Friday Night Lights contest. The national initiative supports small-town high school football programs by upgrading their technology and athletic facilities. Dupo High School was selected as a weekly "\$5K Fridays" winner, securing \$5,000 in immediate funding for our athletic department. The competition continues for small-town schools. If we continue to win, then the next award will be \$25,000. Then, the four \$250,000 division titles and the ultimate \$1 million football field grand prize. We hope to continue in the process and win more for our school, but we are thankful for the \$5,000.00.
- The Bluffview PTO held its annual Taco Night and Book Fair! The Scholastic Book Fair sold \$8,558.54, and the school will earn \$3,682.28 of that amount. This is an awesome turnout and a great way to support our school library!
