Teaching & Learning School Board Update for November 13, 2025

Early Literacy Tutoring

The After School Literacy Tutoring program is officially up and running across all four elementary schools! This session marks an exciting expansion, now serving not only our K-3 rising readers, but also 4th and 5th-grade students needing additional literacy support. A total of 40 students are currently engaged in high-dosage tutoring, receiving personalized instruction from 13 trained tutors. Students meet twice a week for ten weeks for one-on-one or small-group (three students or less) sessions, with regular progress monitoring ensuring effective growth.

Inservice Update

Earlier this week on our district inservice day, K-12 teachers and administrators participated in a history and curriculum professional development session presented by The Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. This event reaffirmed our strong ongoing partnership. Educators utilized this time to also explore the Confederated Tribes' custom-created lessons, ask clarifying questions, and review the range of support and resources the Tribe offers.

Outdoor School

Last week, 140 Sixth Grade Students attended Outdoor School at one of two camps to accommodate all of the students: Camp Cedar Ridge (Veronica) or Camp Arrah Wanna (Welch's). Each group spent three nights. High school students were recruited and trained to be the camp counselors. Accompanying them were Principal Dalton, Associate Principal Tatum, sixth grade staff and several High School Student Camp Counselors.

LEEP: Life Enrichment Education Program is for students with significant cognitive and multiple disabilities, located in classrooms throughout the county. Cost: part of our menu of services from ESD paid for out of flow-through dollars as one of our menu of services provided.

Heron Creek Internalizing: Located at the Marylhurst Campus in Lake Oswego, this is a therapeutic environment for students who have significant emotional problems and need a smaller setting and focused instruction on building self-regulation skills in order to come back to the district.

Heron Creek Externalizing: Located at the Marylhurst Campus in Lake Oswego, this setting is for students with externalizing behavioral disturbances that impact their access to learning. This is a highly structured setting and focused on self-regulation and behavioral supports.

Creston Elementary: an elementary school in PPS that has a unique program with Columbia Regional Programs that work to support the unique needs of students experiencing deaf/ hard of hearing. The program is heavily focused on language development and there is a teacher of the deaf full-time on staff as well as an ELL teacher to support second language development.
