Summer Programs 2014

Shaver SUN

June Program-at PHS

- Garden and Sports Camp, with STEM focus
- PHS Gateway students as Youth Leaders for younger students
- 30-45 students, grades 1-5

Early Kindergarten Transition- at Russell

- 30 incoming kindergarten students in 2 classes
- Day care & parent education (In Spanish and English) shared with Russell, 2 mornings/week
- Multnomah County Library met with parents, gave out books and helped parents sign up for Library cards.

Summer SUN-AT RUSSELL

- 1st-2nd grade class with 20 students doing project based learning
- 3rd-5th grade class with 30 students doing literacy focused, thematic units
- Oregon Children's Theater partnered to provide drama classes to the 1st-5th grade students.

Russell

- Early Kindergarten Transition-16 students participated
- Focus on how to be a K student, learned school routines, procedures, letter sounds and early numeracy skills
- Joined in parent education and meals with Shaver parents

Sacramento

- Early Kindergarten Transition with 17 students
 - o Focus on learning letter names, using Chicka Chicka Boom Boom
 - Name writing, number sense, counting, calendar also addressed
 - School procedures and routines were also taught daily.
- Boys and Girls Club
 - Afternoon program throughout the summer
 - Served 92 students
 - Music Making, Mental Momentum classes, designed to reduce summer learning loss
 - Class modules included: healthy lifestyles or community involvement, incorporating reading, writing, and math
 - Choice time included a physical activity, art, or science.
 - Highlights of the summer:

- The Winterhawks ran a two-day indoor hockey clinic for all kids and provided them all with t-shirts.
- Banfield Pet Hospital provided brand new bikes to selected students (currently the top story on the BGCP facebook page!)
- The Seahawks mascot, players, and the Sea Gal dancers came out for a very special family night, to which all club members were invited
- Field trip to the American Federation of Aviculture's Junior Avian Youth (JAY) "Housing Birds in Captivity" Workshop.

Prescott SUN

- Early Kindergarten Transition with 26 students
 - o 10 parents at parent classes that offered twice a week in English and Spanish
 - Partnered with Multnomah County Library and provided free books in English & Spanish to every student and parent.
 - "These lucky students will be great leaders for the kindergarten students yet to come. They are all having a great time,learning a lot, and are totally ready for kindergarten! The parents have been very enthusiastic about the program and so glad that their children love to come to school!"
- 4 week Summer SUN program with 27 Students
 - 4 Parkrose Middle School students volunteered daily
 - Academic focus on Reading also included recreation activities and an hour of Social and Life activities led by the school counselor.
 - Highlight-field trip to a local farm, where they picked Raspberries and Blueberries and learned about the benefits of healthy eating.
 - Prescott SUN partnered with Portland Parks and Rec to offer a mobile van to provide recreation and arts and crafts activities.
