## Safety Program

The Board recognizes and supports the need to provide a safe environment for employees, students and members of the community who utilize the facilities, services and equipment of the district.

In order to reduce the human suffering, loss of productive time and financial impact that are the natural result of accidental injuries, illness, environmental hazards or other loss exposures, a program of safety training and accident prevention shall be initiated and maintained throughout the district.

The program shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Administrative supervision and inspection of facilities to assure compliance with federal, state and local statutes pertaining to health and safety;
- 2. Safety training for employees to promote safe working practices;
- 3. Instruction and supervision of students to promote knowledge of and adherence to safety practices;
- 4. Training in first aid and emergency care of injured persons.

Notwithstanding any regulation requiring specific action, administrators shall take prompt action to correct any unsafe condition or circumstance that is brought to their attention. Risk management should be called when any questions arise.

Each staff member has a responsibility to notify his/her immediate supervisor as unsafe conditions are identified under this policy.
