Principals Message

I would like to say a big THANK YOU to all of the parents who participated in our parent-teacher conferences this past month. As with any opportunity for parents to visit with staff about their child's progress, I hope you found the time valuable and rewarding. I did receive positive comments afterward from those who attended and it is my hope that for those of you that did not attend that you will in the future. Educational success requires partnerships that make a difference, and a parent's role is the largest one with ensuring students to meet their potential. I look forward to the next chance we have to support our students together.

As we approach the end of the second trimester, I would like to remind parents to continue to monitor your student's grades on Parent Assist and if you would like to meet with any or all of your student's teachers. please contact them. If you have not logged onto Parent Assist, I encourage you to do so. You may contact our office for instructions and your password if you are unsure how to do so. Parent Assist affords you the opportunity to not only look at current grades but open up the teacher's grade book to look at individual assignments, missing assignments, quiz and test grades. You may also monitor your student's attendance and contact teachers by email. This being said, please realize this is a tool that can cause frustration at times due to teachers updating it once a week. There may be times where a standard project may take a couple of weeks to complete where no progress grade is reported... in these cases, or others of concern, please email the teacher to get the whole picture with student achievement.

Lastly, we are in the midst of the cold and flu season. If your student is home ill please contact the attendance office the day of his or her absence so that the school and teachers are notified. We are trying to improve our school wide action with homework requests that benefit students and parents alike. Just as a reminder, once a student reaches 10 or more unexcused absences in a row, the student will be dropped from enrollment and will need to be re-enrolled. We have some students that tend to bounce around this attendance threshold and I am asking for your help with tracking and making an attempt to hold your son/ daughter accountable for their school attendance. It should also be noted that if your student is between the ages of 7 and 18, and has unexcused or excessive absences that can be determined by ORS 339.925 you as the parent may be fined \$150.00. After the third offense for students between the ages of 7-14, the parent may be fined for up to a maximum amount of \$720.00 under ORS 163.577. Please check your student's handbook for an in depth look at our attendance policy. Our main goal is to see students walk across the stage in four years and in most cases, poor attendance negatively affects the student's ability to learn that which is required to attain credits and the essential skills needed for graduation. In other words... we need to be partners!



So far this trimester we have gone over shelter building, water purification, fire starting, food resources, basic trapping, and most recently skinning and fur use.
