BSD Library Media Program 2011-2012 ~ Pending Budget Reductions

Mission: to ensure students are critical thinkers, enthusiastic readers and effective users and producers of ideas and information.

Library Media Specialists prepare **students** for college and career readiness by:

- Teaching students to:
 - locate, evaluate and use information [BSD Library and Information Literacy Learning Targets]
 - o support reading for learning, reading for pleasure and reading for life
 - use the Internet safely and ethically as required by federal law
- Collaborating with teachers to:
 - o teach research skills
 - provide resources supporting and enhancing classroom lessons
 - o train in using new technologies and District systems
- Coordinating the library program to:
 - o create a central learning space where students feel welcome and safe
 - develop a library collection of print and digital resources to meet the diverse needs, interests and abilities of students
 - manage the workflow of Library Assistants, volunteers and student aides
 - o manage the district identity management system (Bkey) for students and staff

Impact of 50% reduction in Library Media Specialist positions

- Students will receive less instruction in critical thinking, literacy and technology skills.
 Instruction in Internet safety is a requirement by the federal government for eRate funding which pays for district Internet connectivity. A plan for this instruction must be determined.
- Individual reading guidance for students in reading selections and genre choice will be limited.
- School-wide literacy programs such as the Oregon Battle of the Books, author visits and Newbery Club may be assigned to classroom teachers and/or volunteers.
- Collaboration and training with teachers and staff in the use of information and new technologies will be diminished.
- Students may have **reduced access** to library resources and technology on days when the Library Assistant is staffing the library alone.
- Libraries may be closed if substitutes are not provided for Library Assistants.

- Student safety and supervision must be addressed, particularly in the secondary libraries due to the physical layout of the library and the numbers of students using the library at one time.
- The value of BSD library collections totals \$43,993,060. A plan must be determined to secure the technology and library resources.
- The process for circulating secondary textbooks must be redesigned.

Additional Impact of 100% reduction in Library Media Specialist positions

- Students in these schools will not have a formal library program.
- Students will **not receive instruction** in Library and Information Literacy learning targets. Individual teachers must be trained to teach Internet safety.
- Fewer books and materials will be in the hands of students and teachers.
- **Libraries will be closed** to students and staff when library assistants are not present due to limited hours, duty schedules and absences.
- Technology and password management support for students and teachers will be curtailed.
- Developing and managing the library collection of books, online resources and other instructional materials is the responsibility of a licensed media specialist according to Administrative Regulation II/IIA-AR.
