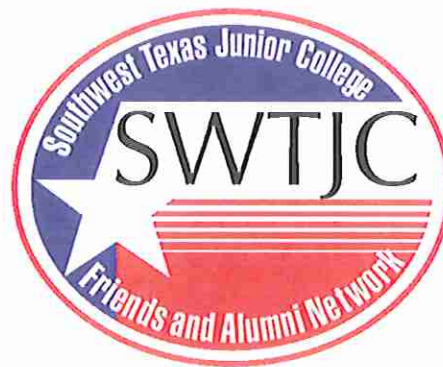

STUDENT AND COMMUNITY USE OF COLLEGE DISTRICT FACILITIES

GF
(LOCAL)

The grounds and facilities of the College District shall be used for the educational goals and purposes of the college as set forth by the Board. Such uses, as determined by the Board and the President, have priority over any other use of College District facilities.

The grounds and facilities of the College District shall be made available to members of the College District community, including students and their respective registered organizations, when such use does not conflict with normally scheduled activities, or any of the policies and procedures of the College District. The requesting student(s) or student organization shall pay all expenses incurred by their use of the facilities. Such expenses are limited to required College District custodial, security, and building staffs.

PERMISSION TO USE

A student or registered student organization may reserve the use of a College District facility through the appropriate dean. The request shall be made in writing and shall include:

1. The student's name or name of the registered student organization.
2. The location of the facility desired and the date and time of the proposed use.
3. The approximate number of persons expected to use the facility.
4. How the facility shall be used.
5. Proposed method of payment for any additional expenses.

CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATION

The dean shall approve an application unless he or she has reasonable grounds to believe that:

1. The college facility requested is unavailable, inadequate, or inappropriate to accommodate the proposed use at the time requested.
2. The applicant is under a disciplinary penalty prohibiting the use of the facility.
3. The proposed use includes nonpermissible solicitation.
4. The proposed use would constitute an immediate and actual danger to the peace or security of the College District that available law enforcement officials could not control with reasonable efforts.
5. The applicant owes a monetary debt to the College District and the debt is considered delinquent.

6. The proposed activity would disrupt or disturb the regular academic program or would result in damage to or defacement of property.
7. The proposed activity would constitute an unauthorized joint sponsorship with an outside group.

If the dean does not approve an application under the above section, the dean shall give the applicant a written statement of the grounds for refusal.

USE OF DESIGNATED
AREAS

The dean shall designate one or more areas of the campus for use by students and registered student organizations by posting signs identifying each designated area in conspicuous locations in and around each area.

A student or registered student organization may use an area designated under the above section for public discussion without prior permission and for peaceful public assembly or demonstration without prior permission.

Public assembly, discussion, or demonstration exercised in accordance with the above paragraphs, must not disturb or interfere with a program, event, or activity approved by the dean prior to the public assembly, discussion, or demonstration, and must not unreasonably disturb or interfere with normal operations and activities of the College District.

In addition to the penalty established by law, any student who refuses to identify himself or herself fully may be subject to institutional discipline, including suspension.

GROUPS PROHIBITED
FROM USE OF
COLLEGE DISTRICT
FACILITIES

No group or organization shall be allowed to use college facilities for private profit-making purposes. The outside activity shall be educational in nature or shall be a community service-type function.

No organization or group, whether registered or not, shall use District facilities if it has a delinquent debt to the District.

All rentals, rates, charges, and fees collected by the District shall be made with the stipulation that the District shall not be liable to anyone for any injury or claim arising out of the use of any District facility.

NO ALCOHOL

No alcoholic beverages shall be served or brought on campus by anyone using College District facilities, except as approved by the Board.
