#### **Current Implementation**

- Thirteen teachers at all four preschool sites
  - Half Day & Full Day
  - English Dominant & Spanish Dominant
  - Blended, Non-Blended and Instructional
- 3 Instructional Coaches



• 100% of staff in Phase 1 have implemented three studies to date: Balls, Trees and Wheels. All staff are currently in the middle of the fourth study: Exercise.

#### Celebrations

- Student Engagement
  - Students are interested in study topics
  - Students are making connections between concepts and asking questions about the concepts throughout the day in different settings
  - Family projects provide evidence of family engagement and student application of concepts learned
- Staff Collaboration
  - Monthly team meetings planning for creative problem solving and hands-on, inquiry based learning
  - High levels of staff collecting and analyzing student observations which inform instruction
  - Staff use innovation to adapt the curriculum to reflect students' interest and classroom dynamics
  - Staff recognize units spring curiosity and active participation with students and families


