Construction Class Gets A New Project!

Unity High School's Diploma Plus Program has helped many graduating students over the past few years earn college credit or certification in addition to their high school diplomas. With the Unity Board of Education adopting a district goal that focuses on "career, college, and technical readiness," there has been a renewed effort to establish cooperative agreements with the Wisconsin Indianhead Technical College (WITC) for transcribed and articulated credit for Unity's students who participate in specific career and technical education (CTE) classes.

Last year, Unity School District, Workforce Resource, and WITC partnered to offer a construction class to high school students. Many local businesses also sponsored the class, as well as provided training and future job opportunities for the students. Last year's class built a concession stand for the Village of Balsam Lake to be used at Pioneer Park. This year, the class will be building a new greenhouse for the agriculture and life sciences classes on the Unity campus. They will be razing the old one and building a new, more efficient, and functional structure.

The District is excited to work with the local businesses, WITC, and Workforce Resource to offer this outstanding educational experience for our students. This is an experience that will result in a building that will be used by scores of Unity students in the future.

Student Open Enrollment Opens Soon for 2019-2020

What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Applications may be submitted to up to three nonresident school districts.

Who may participate in open enrollment?


Pupils in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.

Open enrollment for prekindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2019-20 school year is from February 4-April 30, 2019. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2019. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.
