- Total Enrollment: 1,443

 - Courses available: HIST 1013, HIST 1023, MATH 1303, MATH 1313, ECO 1023, POLS 2013, POLS 2023
- o Online Courses, when needed for graduation
 - o Professional Communications, Health, Spanish I-II, Latin I-II
 - Economics

Boost Program

- Braswell Boost Program
 - o Total Enrollment: 58 (increase from 12 in Summer 2021)
 - Teachers: 8 (2 per core content)
 - Administrator: Dawn McCullough
 - Dates and Times: July 25-28
 - Audience: Students were invited to BHS for advanced academic experiences to create success for fall honors and AP courses. Students will receive teacher mentors in the fall.
 - Purpose: To increase first time or underrepresented student populations in honors/AP courses.
 - Focus area: All four content areas created specialized curriculum that included AVID strategies. The Boost program came from a session at the Dream Deferred Conference attended by Braswell staff.

- Focus area: All four content areas utilized curriculum created for Braswell Boost and added interactive activities based on skills
