NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

We are back! Approximately 280 students have returned for the 2022-2023 school year, the biggest population in many years. Students received their student handbooks that list all of our rules and policies and Advisory teachers have begun reviewing them with students. Parents, please review the student handbook with your students so you are up to date on what we are expecting. The main rules I shared with all students on our first day are:

- 1. Cell phones should be off and away during class time.
- 2. Campus is closed. Students are not allowed to leave campus during the day.

- Add money to your Mealtime Account and Apply for Free and Reduced Lunch.
- Complete the Directory Release Form (attached bellow)
- If you have a student who is planning on driving to school please <u>register</u> them.

The health and safety of our students and school community is of primary importance to all of us. One of our priorities is to ensure that the young people in our schools continue to make healthy choices. During the week of **September 26-30**, we will be administering the *Student Attitudes and Behavior Survey* to students, collaborating with the Hazelden Betty Ford Foundation, (www.hazeldenbettyford.org/prevention.) This survey design measures students' actual attitudes and behavior with regard to alcohol, other substances, tobacco and vaping as well as their *perceptions* of the behavior and attitudes of their schoolmates. It is **completely anonymous**; no individual student can be identified from responses, and all data will be presented only by group (grade, age, etc.) Parents will have an option to opt out of the survey. An informational letter will be sent home the week prior including opt out options. Thank you in advance for your commitment to the health and wellness of our school community!

Return to school will be based off of ODE/OHA COVID-19 scenarios for schools and in combination with the 21/22 ODE/OHA Communicable Disease guidance.

IF symptoms persist more than one day, parents should consider evaluation by the child's health care provider who can determine if viral testing is advised.

- If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, they should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours
 and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school.
- Unexplained rashes or eye infections will be excluded unless confirmation from a health care provider

Free and Reduced Price Meal Income Guidelines Announced for 2022-23 School Year If you have not already completed your 2021-2022 Meal Time application for free and reduced lunches it is important that you do so now. By completing this now will give you a 30 day grace period in the till October 17. Otherwise, you will need to be prepared to pay full price for all breakfast and lunches until your 2022-2023 application is approved in the fall.

For the 2022-2023 school year there will no longer be free meals for all as we have had the last couple years with COVID.


Fall is a very important time for seniors, especially as they prepare to transition into their postsecondary plans. Advisory is where much of this important work is being done. Priorities for this term will be:
