Instruction & Classroom Highlights

- 4th Grade Cribbage Program: Fourth graders are beginning to learn cribbage and will host *Cribbage Afternoons*, inviting community members to come and play against students. The first session begins this Friday.
- 2nd Grade STEAM Dash Robot Balloon Parade: Our annual Balloon Parade using Dash robots is currently underway as part of 2nd grade's engineering and computer science work.
- 6th Grade Science Green Snap Circuits: Sixth graders are completing their battery-free circuits project while learning about kinetic and potential energy.
- Kindergarten Experiences: Kindergarteners enjoyed a visit from Doctor Science and launched Book Buddies with older students.
- 1st and 4th Grade Book Buddies: Continued cross-grade literacy partnerships supporting fluency, confidence, and connection.
- 3rd Grade Experiences:
 - Students met their Grand Friends.
 - PTO sponsored a field trip to the Mille Lacs Indian Museum.
 - Local radio station will donate dictionaries to all 80 third-grade students on 11/25.
