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





Parents are becoming gradually less committed. They are ready for summer break. They were more active at the beginning of the month.



Intervention Level

Intervention Groups Defined

- A1- (IEP or referral in process) focus is on individual literacy goals
- A- Focus is on building phonemic awareness and letter knowledge

B- Focus is on securing phonemic skills, letter knowledge, and learning to blend sounds into words

C- Focus is on blending words, gaining high frequency words, reading decodable text



D- Focus is on securing blending skills, gaining additional sound-spelling correspondences, securing high frequency words, and reading a variety of connected text

The goal is for all Kindergarten students to achieve Level C or above. As of March 12,(last day of instruction) 81 students (55%) had met that goal.

Assessments Given

Phonics Survey Parts A-D: Groups A1, A, B Blending & High Frequency Word List: Group C Dibels Nonsense Word Fluency: Group D


Group Data as of March 12

A1- Of the 13 students, the highest score was 35/85

- A- Of the 29 students, (100% mastery score is 85)
 - 3 scored above 68
 - 9 scored between 51-67
 - 17 scored below 50
- B- Of the 24 students, (100% mastery score is 85)
 - 13 scored above 68
 - 10 scored between 51-67
 - 1 scored below 50
- C- OF the 56 students,
 - 31 scored at least 8/10 on the blending assessment
- D- Of the 25 students,
 - 16 have met the EOY nonsense word fluency benchmark

Thank you Robert and Kim for getting the approval for our KW/Vina Elementary/ BPS District Parade to see our "Sacred Beings".














School Counselor (submitted by: Tammy Hall-Reagan)
