Teachers have plenty of student data. they have looked at the data and put together intervention groups. Students are being pulled for intervention during Tiger Period. Some teachers have implemented data folders to make the students aware of their performance on district assessments. Everyone is being held accountable for student learning. We continue to prep our Juniors and Seniors for post-graduation. Recently, we had the Marines present to our Juniors and Seniors. They will soon be taking the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) (optional). This will measure a student's eligibility for enlistment and job placement in the Armed Forces. We have started compiling a list of students who will be getting certifications before graduating high school.
