**Purpose of the Report:** Board Work Session

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The vision of Oak Park Elementary School District 97 is to create a positive learning environment for all D97 students that is equitable, inclusive, and focused on the whole child. Our “big rocks” or strategic goals to achieve this vision are:

1. *Align D97 systems, structures and processes to reflect our stated value of educating the whole child (e.g., we act in ways that reflect our understanding of supporting the successful development of each and every student).*
2. *Establish a comprehensive system of support for all District 97 staff.*

When we achieve this vision, each student in our district will either achieve or experience the following universal goals:

- Every community member feels like a partner in supporting our schools and each and every student
- Students and staff feel empowered, valued, and respected
- Every student is challenged and engaged
- All students have access to programs and supports to prepare them for success in high school
- We support every student to be a critical thinker, ready to contribute to their community
- Each student is known for who they are and their unique needs are met
- Students feel safe and a sense of belonging
- Caring adult-student relationships
- Students lead their own learning and become lifelong learners

D97 is a learning organization; we routinely reflect on where we are in relationship to our universal goals in order to plan actions to continually improve our practices and processes. On February 6, 2017, the D97 Ad Leadership team, along with MTSS School-Level Leaders and Instructional Coaches, engaged in an SY17 Winter Data Dive, grounded in the ongoing vision work. The conversation included newly available NWEA MAP, DIBELS, attendance, behavior, GPA, and middle school risk & opportunity data. For the first time teacher leaders (*MTSS Leaders and Instructional Coaches*) were included in this district-level data conversation. Participants had time to work with their job-alike peers (e.g. Instructional Coaches working together), as well as significant work and reflection time with their school teams (Principal, AP/SSS, Coach, and MTSS Leader). School teams left the session with next steps identified, and those action plans will be revisited in March SIT monitoring visits. Since the Board of Education has a goal build knowledge and understanding of the four terms framing the District vision and goals (Board Goal 1), during Tuesday’s regularly scheduled meeting, we will facilitate a working session for the Board using the facilitation deck found at [this link](#).
