Noodles in Cups or Packages @ Lunchtime

We are experiencing a new trend where students are bringing these packaged noodles or noodles in a cup to school for lunch. The problem is that they are bringing them uncooked. We only have 1 microwave to use in our kitchen and if there are 4 or 5 students with these noodles and it takes 3 minutes for one cup or package— and not to mention how hot they are after cooking them. This uses up the students lunch period. We also don't have the right bowls to cook the packaged noodles. SO if your student wants these kind of noodles for lunch—please cook them at home and we can warm them up in your containers, which only takes approximately 30 seconds to 1 minute at the most.

Spring Time Weather

WE should be experiencing some beautiful spring days very soon. This is to remind parents that students are to wear appropriate clothing to school.

All girls K-8th are not to wear spaghetti strap tops or short shirts that expose their mid sections. No short shorts or unreasonable short skirts. Students must be able to sit in their chairs and not have to constantly adjust their clothing.

Grades k-4, girl or boy, are not to wear flip-flops or open toed shoes to school. We have found that students stubbed theirs toes or flip-flops have broken and then they have no shoes to replace the broken ones. Flip-flops are allowed for middle school students <u>if</u> they have a pair of PE shoes to change into.

If we feel clothing is inappropriate or a distraction, we will have your student call home for a change of clothing or use loaner clothes.

Milkweed Project

When school began in September the 3/4th grade class planted Milkweed seeds in the greenhouse. They hypothesis was—will planting Milkweed Seeds in the greenhouse in the fall produce a stronger plant to be repotted in the spring?

Each student made a prediction and learned about the scientific process.

Some predictions were that it would be a good idea and some thought it would be a bad idea. So far it may have partly been a bad idea. The seeds sprouted for a short while then stopped. It also became very cold. The greenhouse door was found to be opened slightly over one of our cold periods and the majority of the seedlings died from exposure.

A fresh batch was planted further into winter have now sprouted and look much healthier than the first try. There's more to it and updates will come. The predictions and a diary are in the greenhouse for viewing.

Also be thinking if you have a spot to plant a few milkweed plants for the Monarch. We still plan on selling some starts if we are successful. By Linda Kappen
