### 2023-2024 Summary - Highlights

During the 2023-2024 school year:

- Reduced Major Office Discipline Referrals
- Attendance / Chronic absenteeism
- 47% of students met or exceeded expected growth in Reading (combined)
- 58% of students met or exceeded expected growth in Math

# Goal # 1 Educational Equity

By Spring of 2025, Oak Park will measure a 10% decrease in Major Student Discipline Referrals from the 23-24 school year.

- Create monthly goals for student behavior based on data
- Incentivize expected behavior on a school, classroom, and individual level
- Teach expectations K-5 at the onset of the year with re-teaching in January and April
- Teach expectations to Preschool students as each area is entered, on an ongoing basis
- Study of behavior incidents to find patterns followed by action plan







#### Goal # 2 Operational Excellence

#### Oak Park will maintain a cumulative monthly average daily attendance rate of 95% for the 2024-2025 school year.

- Daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly incentives
- Daily phone calls from office staff
- Monthly letters and attendance resources to parents
- Parent meetings and attendance contracts
- Attendance Rocks Assembly for Tier 3 students
- Study of absences to determine patterns
- Traveling Trophy for Preschool





# Goal # 4 Student Achievement

EDUCATION EQUITY Meet the diver needs of all stud by ensuring a study and inclusive lag

By Spring of 2025, 80% of Preschool students will show improvement in both LLD 10 (Pre-writing W1) and LLD6 (Comprehension / retelling - RI 2) from their Fall baseline score.

- Utilization of TPOT Data
- Visit classrooms to monitor instruction
- Utilization of the Preschool Coaching Model
- Defined MTSS structure

By Winter of 2024, 60% of Students K-5 will meet or exceed their expected growth goals in reading as measured by NWEA MAP.


Action Plan:
