Kyle Luedtke Superintendent	• I have attended seven of our ten municipality regular monthly board meetings. Highlighting our budget, the solar project, shared services with Luck SD and the community survey. I still need to visit with West Sweden, Daniels and LakeTown. • Our recent installation of solar panels indicate from Sept. 17 thru Oct. 17 a decrease in the electric bill at the 6-12 building of \$120.01. Brandon Olson will continue to monitor the financial impact. • Mrs. Hansford and I met with the Frederic Ministries last week. They requested we attend their meeting. They want to know manners in which they can assist the schools. We shared some financial manners and some volunteer opportunities. • At the end of the month I will be attending the WiRSA (Wisconsin Rural School Alliance) conference. I will be presenting a breakout session on referendums. Additionally I will be posthumously presenting an award to a principal. • Our open enrollment for 25-26 is currently at 95 students out. The same figure as for the 24-25 school year. Our open enrolled in has dropped from 49 to 38 students
Erin Hansford Elementary Principal	• Northwestern WI Electric visited our 4th graders on the 10th to explore electricity, how it is distributed around the region, and the importance of safety. The students got to see various photos of our electrical grid and its components, hold a variety of pieces of electrical line, and even explore melted formations from when electricity passes through different objects. • The NED Show returned to Frederic last week with a motivational message infused with yo-yo tricks, magic and a little comedy. NED stands for Never Give Up, Encourage Others, and Do Your Best! Our Stronger Connections Grant allowed us to purchase a yo-yo for every Elementary student in a Pay It Forward program, allowing NED a chance to travel to another school! • We have successfully worked with CESA 6 to set up the Frontline platform for our Educator Effectiveness teacher evaluation system. All teachers were introduced to Frontline's new platform at Monday's Inservice and have begun the process of creating personal and professional goals for the school year.

We used the AimsWeb to create groups in ELA and Math for middle school and the PreACT data we used for students to see their general areas of weakness to focus there in ACP time. • Photography field trip went well, they are in the editing phase of the process now with those photos. • Middle school had mock interviews for a future career they were interested in. • Prom location is picked (Coyland) and they are now fundraising for that. • NHS Applications - We had 18 eligible candidates and we had 10 apply! We are in the review process for that and the induction ceremony is 11/3/2025 • ASVAB is 10/29.
Jada Anderson Pupil Services Director	• Kelly Fisher and myself attended a Wisconsin Multi-Level Systems of Support Workshop at CESA. During that time, we were able to reflect on our current Universal Instruction practices, as well as how to maximize the use of data to drive decision making processes for whole group lessons. • Erin Hansford and myself completed a Title III virtual site visit with a

	representative from CESA 11. During this time we talked about overarching processes to ensure compliance with students who are identified as ELL in the district. Currently, we have three ELL students enrolled at Frederic. ● Per ACT 20 requirements, parents have been notified if their students require a Personal Reading Plan (PRP) based on the screener scores from Fall Assessments. In that notification, parents were able to see what areas of reading their students have deficiencies in and plans moving forward for their students. A personal reading plan will be sent out for those specific students at the end of this month.
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
