Process for proposed BCMS cuts

- A. Scheduling Task Force was formed and determined the following priorities:
 - Keep all Read 180 classes
 - Make class size as low as possible •
 - Keep class sizes equal each class period
 - Keep teams if possible
- B. Parent input was solicited via our Parent Advisory Committee:
 - The PAC agreed that small class size is important
 - Keep as many options as possible (enriched, remedial and electives)
- C. The BCMS Leadership Team discussed options and gave input. There was consensus that overall cuts rather than specific targeted program cuts were essential.
- D. All department chairs were informed of proposed cuts to their department. Together we worked through numbers and developed our current scenarios.

Impact of proposed BCMS cuts:

- Reduction in accelerated/enriched English and A. math classes (loss of Gifted and Talented).
- Decrease in number of 8th grade elective B. options.
- С. Class size increases (see chart).
- Teachers teaching multiple grades means they D. will be part of multiple teams.
- E. 6th grade teacher (2 at least) moving to elementary positions due to license restrictions.
