


Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Use/Ever - Grade 6 (n=813): Nov 2021



Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Use/Ever-Grade 10 (n=614): Nov 2021









Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Use/Ever-Grade 12 (n=397): Nov 2021




Vaping and Injected Substance Use/Ever - Grade 6 (n=813): Nov 2021




Vaping and Injected Substance Use/Ever - Grade 8 (n=898): Nov 2021




Vaping and Injected Substance Use/Ever - Grade 10(n=614): Nov 2021
