## What is Character Strong?

"Character Strong: A comprehensive social-emotional learning curriculum that builds positive school culture through trauma-informed, research-based character development"

## **Three Core Components:**

- Daily Character Lessons
  - Morning meetings with character focus Age-appropriate SEL skill building

  - Consistent school-wide language and expectations
- **Trauma-Informed Practices** 
  - Understanding student behavior through trauma lens Building safety and connection first

  - Healing-centered approach to discipline
- Positive Culture Systems
  - School-wide character recognition
  - Community building activities
  - Staff and student leadership development

"Our Goal: Create a safe, supportive environment where all students can learn and grow, especially those who have experienced trauma or adversity."



# Implementation Effectiveness - Building Positive Culture

## **Data Comparison Areas:**

### **Office Discipline Referrals:**

- 2023-24 Baseline: 105 Office Discipline Referrals (August through September)
- Current (Sept 2025): 77 Office Discipline Referrals
- Target: Reduce by 20% through Character Strong positive culture approach

#### **Social-Emotional Skills Trends:**

- Students Demonstrating SEL Skills: 74%
- Students Needing Character Support: 26%
- Goal: 80% of students thriving in positive character culture



# **Monthly Character Focus & Goal**

# **Monthly Character Strong Implementation Process:**

- Character Theme Focus: Monthly school-wide character trait emphasis
- Student Recognition: Celebrating character growth and positive choices
- Staff Development: Ongoing Social-Emotional Learning, trauma-informed practice training
- Family Engagement: Home-school character development partnership

**Our Goal:** 80% of students thriving in positive character culture, as measured by:

- Reduction in office discipline referrals due to positive behavior choices
- Youth Needs Screener and Strengths and Needs Screener scores showing strong social-emotional development



# Research Foundation - Character Development & Trauma-Informed Practices

## **Character Strong Research Base - Three Key Areas:**

### 1. Academic Outcomes

 Students in strong character programs show 10-15% improvement in academic achievement due to better emotional regulation and engagement

## 2. Behavioral Improvements

 Schools with comprehensive character education see 30-50% reduction in disciplinary issues and improved school climate

#### 3. Trauma-Informed Benefits

 Trauma-informed SEL approaches help students develop resilience, improving attendance, engagement, and long-term success

"Research shows that when students feel safe, connected, and valued through character development, they're better able to learn, grow, and overcome challenges including trauma impacts."
