REMEDIATION OF UNSATISFACTORY CITIZENSHIP Schools will put in place systems of remediation for students who are at "unsatisfactory" levels of citizenship or are approaching unsatisfactory levels by being at the "needs improvement" level during an academic term. Possible interventions may include placement in study hall, meeting with administration and parents to discuss improvement, attendance contracts, behavior contracts, etc.
