What is the mission of the non-profit/community organization? *
The Celebrate! Maya Project Project Youth Writing & History Immersion Project is to offer middle school and high school students an interactive writing, interviewing, art, book publishing and History immersion experience, affording them onsite experience, in: writing, interviewing, art creation, and book designing.

What service(s) does the non-profit/community organization provide? *

Our local partners will identify community leaders--past and present--who agree to participate in this project, including sharing their life stories with youth. These "history makers" will be asked to participate in a one day program that will include a panel discussion, and a 30-minute interview session with student participants. The Writing and History Immersion workshop will be an excellent opportunity for young people to meet and talk with Arkansas History Makers who have made positive impacts on our state's and communities' growth. CMP will provide mentorship, feedback, and support to the student participants throughout the writing process. There will be a ceremony held to recognize the contributions of the students, and history makers which will include a book signing once the book is completed.

Describe the kinds of volunteer tasks students will perform.

Student participants will attend two 2-hour Writing Workshops, and a panel discussion. The first workshop will focus on learning interview techniques and writing skills. Students will attend a panel discussion meeting, and have the opportunity to meet one-on-one with a History Maker and to conduct a 30- minute interview. Student participants will work on the editing their interviews and creating artwork to go along with their projects. For the remaining period of this project, students will work independently on writing the interviews, and they will be supported when they have questions or need feedbacking during the writing process.
