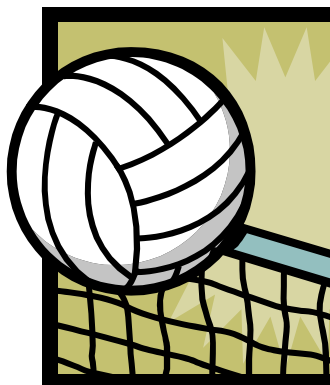

# TWO NEW PROGRAMS AT IVHS

## OREGON VARSITY VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

IVHS was accepted as one of the pilot schools into the OVVP – Oregon Varsity Volunteering Program – an offshoot of Oregon Volunteers. We are one of several schools in Oregon that were accepted. The program is aimed at schools in rural areas where volunteering is more challenging.

The program will help students serve their community through volunteering, learn how to create volunteer projects, commit to doing a large number of volunteer hours, be recognized for their efforts (akin to athletic, academic, and other "varsity lettering"), and translate their volunteer service into resume experience and college application strengths for after high school. Students can join the program, do volunteering on their own, in their community, with their school, and in support of national service days. Through these special opportunities to complete a set number of hours during the year, they can "letter" in volunteer within the state program and through the school.

Ms. Butler is serving as the advisor. We are excited to be able to honor the service of young people with a "letter" the same as a varsity athlete.

## COUGAR ALL-STARS

We are also excited to launch the Cougar All-star program this year. The purpose of this program is to provide an avenue for high school students to be role models for success in high school to Evergreen students. High school students must qualify and submit a complete application in order to be considered.

Cougar All-stars will have baseball type "player cards" made up with their picture on the front and their "stats" (things they are involved in, grades, attendance, etc.) on the back. Evergreen students will collect these cards which will be given out as prizes and rewards. Once an Evergreen student collects an entire "team" the high school students on that team will go down to Evergreen, spend some time with the students, have lunch, sign cards, etc. We are also planning on making team posters and t-shirts that the Evergreen kids can earn.

To be eligible for the Cougar All Stars program for 2011- 2012, the following requirements must be met:

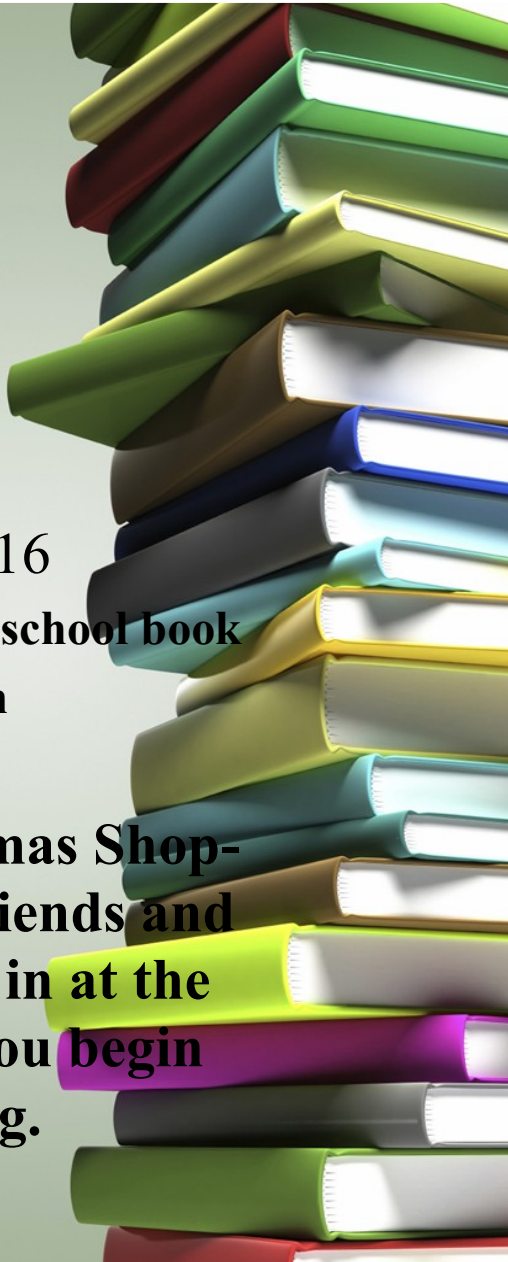
- Be an IVHS student
- Be willing to be an example to elementary school students
- Have "C" average or above – 2.0+ GPA
- Have 92% or better overall attendance
- Have limited referrals. *Referrals will be looked at on an individual basis.*
- Be involved in at least one sport or activity
- Be involved in some kind of community service
- Have 3 recommendations – one staff, one community, and one student.
- Be willing to take a pledge to stay drug/alcohol free for high school.**
- Submit a complete application by December 9, 2011

## AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING AND HOMEWORK HELP

Starting January 9th, we will be offering after school homework help **four** nights a week from 3:45—5:45. The after-school bus will transport students home on two of those nights—Monday and Wednesdays. Students who are staying for after-school tutoring and who are riding the bus are expected to stay in the classroom the entire time. Students who are walking, being picked up, or driving themselves may leave when they are finished working. **Students may not leave the campus and return later.** Students are given a 15 minute break and snack about 4:30. There is no cost for this snack.

No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport.

Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance. Many students could benefit from this extra help, so encourage your students to attend if they need the extra help.

Additionally, the computer lab is open every night between 3:30 and 4:45 Monday—Friday for student use. This time is intended for school related research and typing of reports and papers.



## PROGRAM TO HELP HOMELESS STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am Barbara Gamble, the Family Advocate for Illinois Valley High School. The purpose of the Family Advocate is to help students overcome barriers to success. I will help students acquire jackets, clothes, school supplies, hygiene supplies, glasses, dental appointments, haircuts, etc. I will also advocate for students: For example, helping them get testing or counseling, acquiring birth certificates, arranging for extra tutoring and other related services.

In addition, there is a federal law called the **McKinney-Vento** which gives additional assistance to students that meet the federal definitions of "homeless" these include:

- Living in a home with no heat or running water
- Staying with friends or other relatives due to economic hardships or loss of housing
- Fleeing a domestic violence situation
- Living in a car, van, bus, tent or other non-permanent structure

Living in one of the above situations may also entitle a student to:

- Transportation to their home school should homelessness require a move
- Immediate enrollment, even if there are issues, such as not having in hand:
  - o A birth certificate(s) for the child (ren)
  - o Immunization forms
