

#### Health Room Hints Because We Care...

Appearance/Behavior: Unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to wake, confused or irritable.

- Eyes: Thick mucus or pus draining from the eye or pink eye.
- ♥ Fever: A temperature of 100.5 degrees or higher. Please keep your child home for 24 hours after fever is absent without fever reducing medicine.
- ♥ Brown or green nose drainage: With fever over 100.5.
- ♥ **Sore throat:** Especially if associated with a fever and/or swollen glands.
- Diarrhea: 3 or more episodes in a 24 hr. period with or without fever OR sudden onset of loose stools.
- ♥ Vomiting: Vomiting 2 or more times within the last 24 hours.
- ♥ Rash: especially if associated with a fever or if located on the hands, feet, and mouth area.
- ♥Lice: Children will be checked if there is a suspected infestation and parents will be notified of positive results. Please notify the school if you find head lice on your child.
