The chaperone shall not encourage or allow students to ipate in any activity that is in violation of District policy during the field trip or excursion, ding during the hours following the end of the day's activities. Chaperones shall be given a of these rules and sign a letter of understanding verifying they are aware of and agree to District rules before being allowed to accompany students on any field trip or excursion.
Distri	chaperone found to have violated these rules shall not be used again as a chaperone for any ct-sponsored field trips or excursions and may be excluded from using District-sponsored portation for the remainder of the field trip or excursion and be responsible for their own

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     transportation back home. Employees found to have violated these rules may be subject to
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     disciplinary action.
