## GIFTS FROM THE PUBLIC

The Superintendent may accept gifts and donations of property to the District on behalf of the Board if their value is equal to or less than \$5,000. The Board may accept any bequest or gift of money or property on behalf of the District if their value is more than \$5,000. Any gift or grant that requires Board approval by its terms or by law must go to the Board for acceptance or denial. The gift shall become the sole property of the District for its use and disposition. All gifts shall be given to the District and not to a particular school. At the discretion of the Superintendent or designee, the gift may be used in a particular school.

## CRITERIA FOR ACCEPTANCE

To be acceptable, a gift must have a purpose consistent with District goals and objectives. Gifts will not be accepted if they:

- 1. Begin a program that the administration would be unwilling to take over when the gift or grant funds are exhausted.
- 2. Bring unreasonable or hidden costs to the District.
- 3. Restrict any school program.
- 4. Imply endorsement of any business or product.
- 5. Conflict with policies or actions of the Board or public law.
- 6. Require extensive maintenance on the part of the District.
