Know – Grades 6-9

The Turtle Lake School District will host a career day every other year for all students in grades 6-12. Students in grades 6-9 will participate in classroom and online activities in their Xello accounts to help them determine their interests and potential occupations. Middle school students will take a variety of elective courses: Spanish, Art, Technology, Communications, and Agriculture. Students in 8th grade will partake in a variety of ACP activities including job applications, mock interviews, resume writing, Junior Achievement, and a career day at Northwood Tech. Students in 9th grade will take a required semester-long Careers class in which they will be exposed to reality lessons, budgeting, and personal finance. They will be asked to complete a full-day job shadow in one of the 16 career clusters. The Pre-ACT will also be given to all freshmen in the spring of the school year to predict future college readiness. At the end of the year, all students in grades 6-12 will have a parent/mentor conference to discuss scheduling and elective course options.

Explore – Grade 10

Students will begin to take elective courses that coincide with their career interests. 10th grade students will take a required Civics course during the year, as well as complete the Civics Exam which is a graduation requirement set by the State of Wisconsin. Students in 10th grade will be exposed to budgeting skills, savings goals, and responsible finances. They will also complete a skills assessment to help with career planning. Students who plan on attending college after high school can participate in college campus tours throughout the year and during summer school. All 10th-grade students will take the ACT Aspire assessment which predicts future college readiness.

Plan – Grade 11

Students in 11th grade will participate in a career day which is held every other year. They will continue to take elective courses which coincide with their career interests. Students will attend a career day hosted by Northwood Tech in Rice Lake, and they will also attend a college fair at UW-Eau Claire, Barron County. The Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development has a statewide Youth Apprenticeship program available for those who qualify. 11th-grade students will have the option to participate in that program. All 11th-grade students will take the ACT. They will also take the ASVAB assessment which helps students identify interests and abilities while also gaining information on career exploration. 11th-grade students who plan on attending college after high school will also have the option to participate in college campus tours during the school year and summer school.

Go – Grade 12

Students in 12th grade will continue to take elective courses that coincide with their career interests. Students in 12th grade will have full access to the Xello site and will also receive assistance from our guidance counselor with scholarships, applications, and financial aid. The Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development has a statewide Youth Apprenticeship program available for those who qualify. 12th-grade students will have the option to participate in that program. All 12th-grade students will take a semester-long Personal Finance course. 12th-grade students who plan on attending college after high school will also have the option to participate in college campus tours during the school year.
