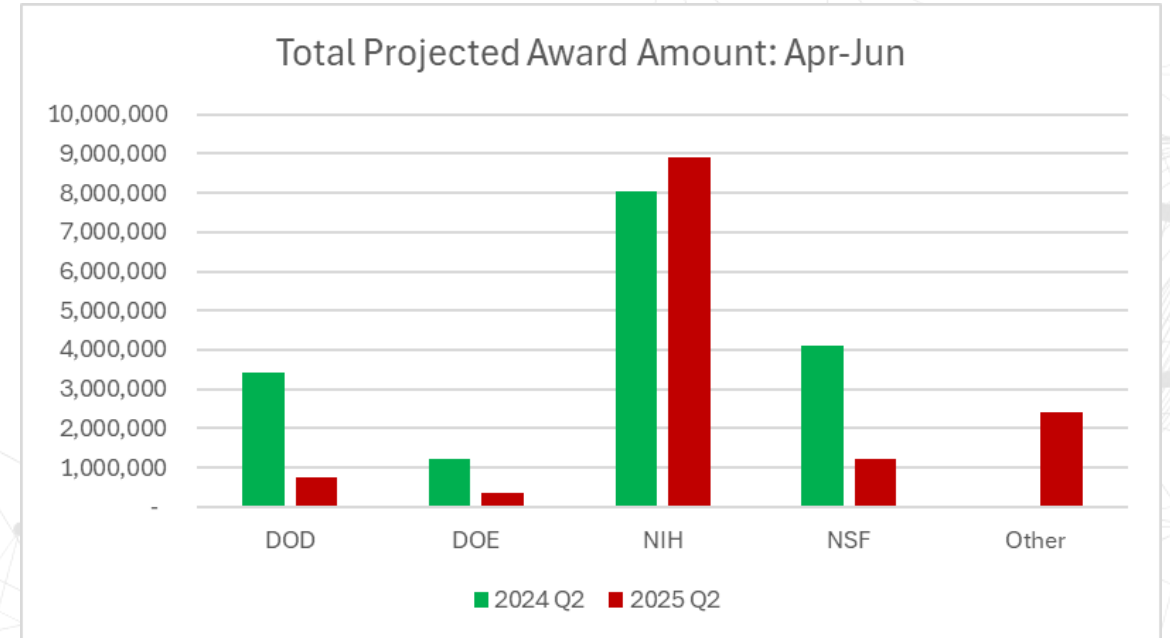
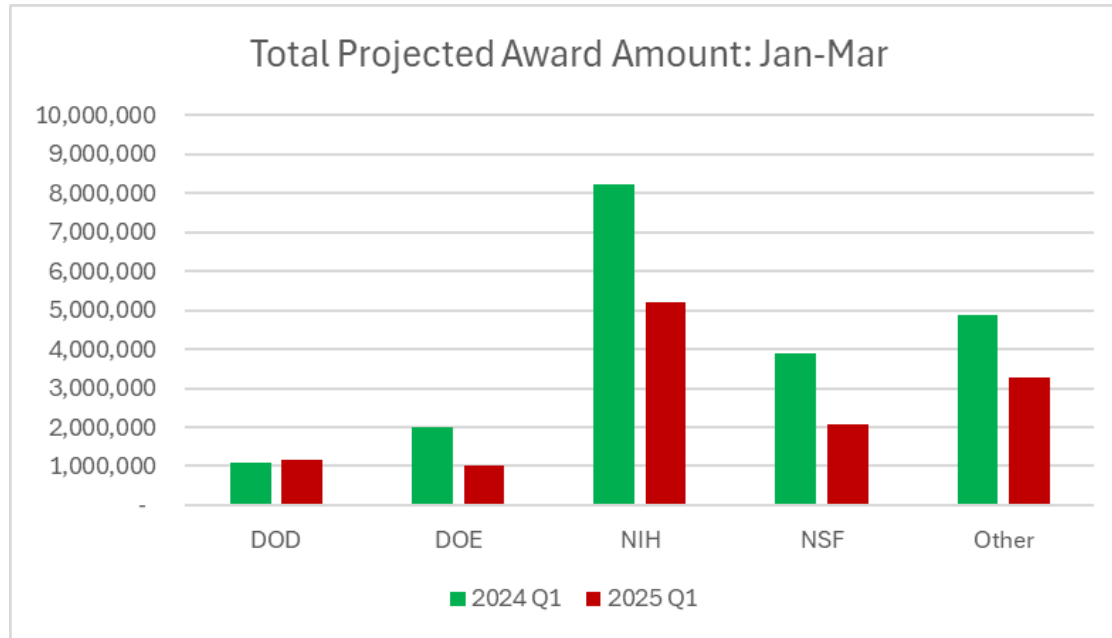

 - Decreases in total projected award amount in both periods
 - BUT: smaller decline in Q2 than in Q1

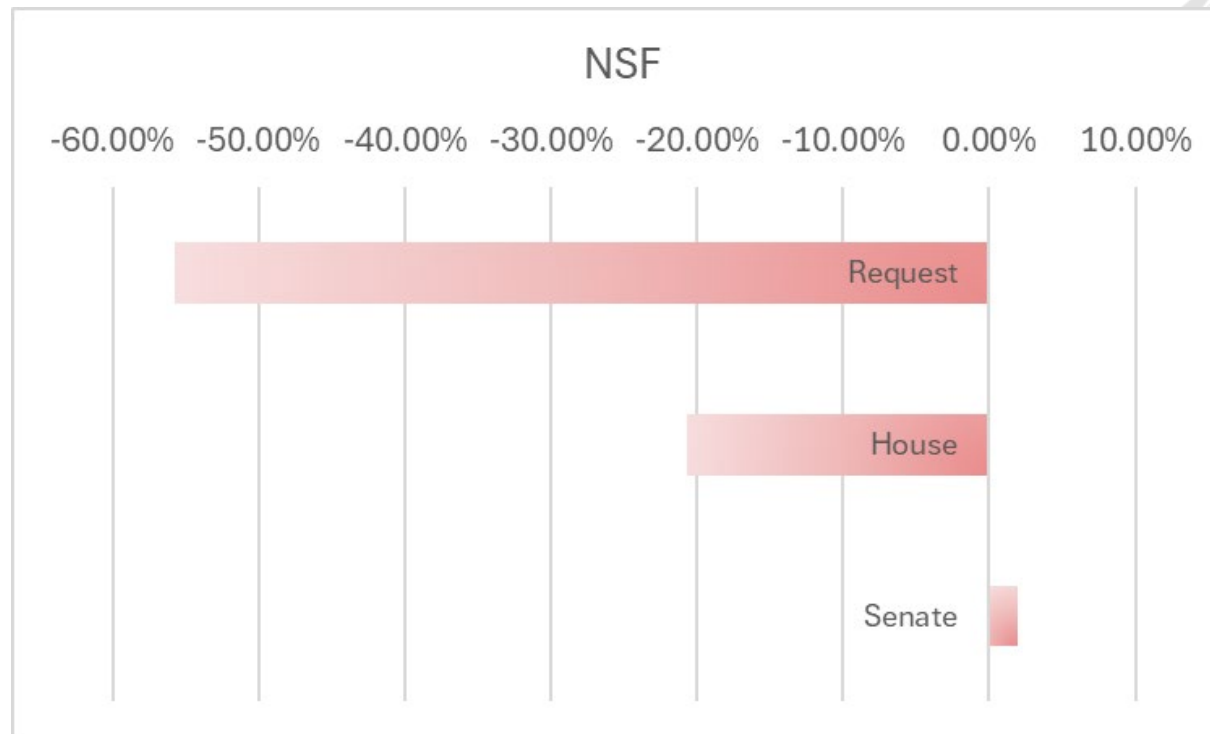
Federal Awards: By Agency

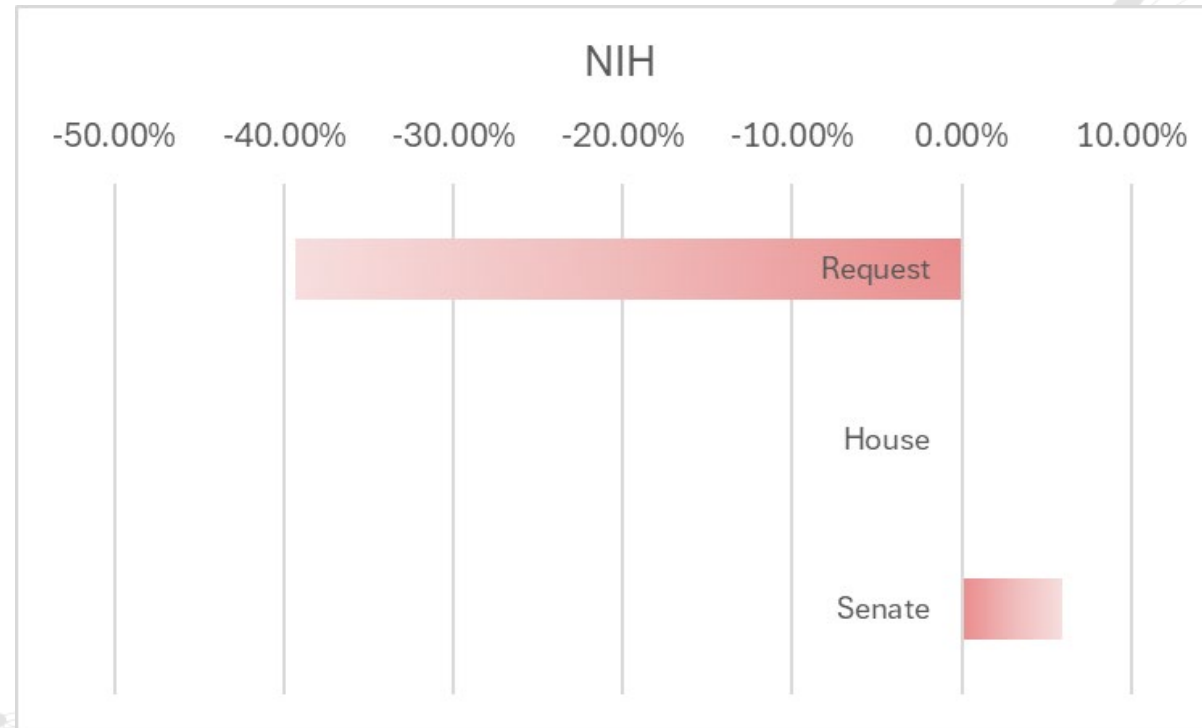

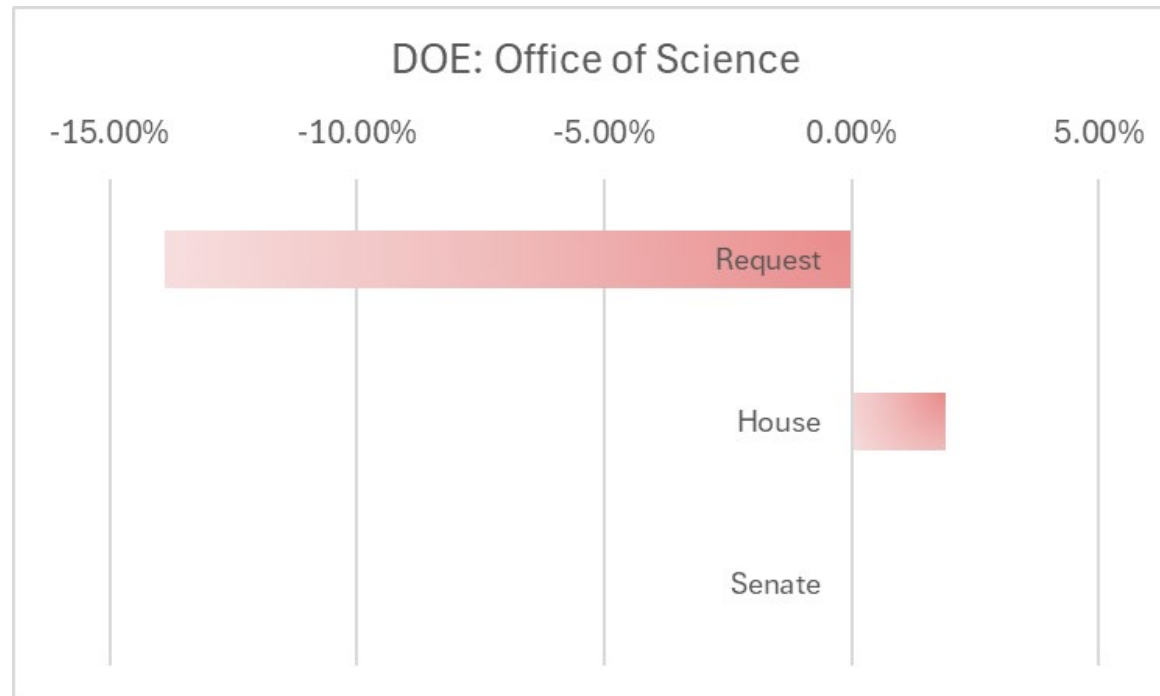
