What Has the RVYCF Work Crew Been Up To?

What has the RVYCF Work Crew been up to? Well here, I'll tell you about some of the things we do. Outdoors

- Mow, weed-eat, edge, aerate and fertilize the grass around the building
- Repair the mowers, put on new blades when needed
- Transplant plants
- Repair sprinklers with the help of *StaffD*
- Paint the walls and the yellow/white lines in the courtyard
- Power wash the walls, cement, and underneath the basketball court
- Set up for outside sports activities (football, soccer, softball)
- Blow and bag leaves
- Wash windows
- Back in the day, there was a big pile of dirt and rocks in the corner of the sweat lodge area. We
 took all the big rocks down and made a small mound over it. We placed black lining, netting,
 bark and flowers in the empty space.
- We have put down sod. Sod is grass strips like turf that we plant where the grass has died. We tilled up the dead areas with a rototiller, used the wheelbarrow to haul some of the dirt out, then laid the sod. We loaded the heavy dirt on tarps into a truck. Whew!
- Indoors
- Strip, buff, wax floors
- Clean the flats in the Manufacturing Technology classroom, Clinic, and gym
- Deep clean and power wash the flats in all units
- Polish the mirrors
- Repair broken soap dispensers
- Dust the cameras
- Clean the gym floor, gym walls, library
- Sanitize the weights
- Vacuum the library
- Clean IPR (Individual Placement Rooms) and CIU (Crisis Intervention Rooms)
- Clean the intake area and visitation
- Repair the dryers
- Clean out the sink and shower drains when they are clogged. This is a very nasty job! You take an "air ram," which is a tool that shoots air, and put it down the drain. When you pull the trigger, you hope it doesn't get all over you too much. Hey, it's dirty but it has to get done. If we can't get it out with the air ram, then we "snake" it with a plumbing tool. A snake is a long metal coil that goes down the drain either pushing the clog out or grabbing it to pull out.
- The boxes that you see around your bed, well we're the ones who clamp them on. We epoxied four squares from a fire blanket on the bottom of each one so the box doesn't scratch the floor and isn't as loud.
- Set up the beds. We turn the single beds into doubles. It's simple and for a "motor head" like me, anything to do with wrenches is a real privilege. For new guys with no experience with tools, being on the work crew is the perfect opportunity to learn about them, so when they leave they can say, "I know how to do that."

That's most of the stuff we get to learn how to do. The work crew is a great opportunity for anyone. I've met a lot of cool people while I've been on the work crew. Being able to work with them, getting to know them and hearing their stories has been a real privilege. Another great thing about being on the work crew is being able to get out and enjoy the fresh air. It's doing something that makes you feel good about yourself because you can say "I did that" or "I can do that for you." The best thing about the work crew is working with *StaffB*, *StaffP*, *StaffM*, *StaffL*, and *StaffD*. If you listen to them, you can learn so much and without them, not much around here could get done.



Rogue Ambassadors

A Rogue Community College Opportunity

Rogue Ambassadors is a merit scholarship for high school graduates. Students selected as Rogue Ambassadors (RA) are required to have an outstanding academic record in high school, agree to perform service hours in the community, and enroll in mandatory courses. The RAs' scholarship begins in the fall each year and pays one half of recipients' tuition (up to nine credits) in the first year following high school graduation. If eligibility requirements are met, full tuition up to eighteen credits per term is paid in the second year. Summer term enrollment is not covered. RA's are responsible for payment for their books and other college fees.

Rogue Ambassadors are looked upon as leaders and role models in class, on campus, and within the community. Rogue Ambassadors are therefore required to complete volunteer community service each year within the program. Community service jobs must serve the RCC or greater community in some way and cannot be paid positions. Students who accept a RA Scholarship should meet with their advisor to plan their first term and register for RA specific classes, as established by their academic advisors.

Christmas Decorating





Black History Month, also known as African-American History Month, is an annual observance in the United States, Canada, and the United Kingdom for the remembrance of important African-Americans and events in history. Historically, it was African-American organizations that took on the cause for change in American society. These groups helped make our world a better place. Interesting people, organizations, and facts about Black History Month include:

- Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, which reinforced the ending of slavery in 1863.
- In 1915, Carter G. Woodson, created the Association for the study of Negro Life and History and in 1926 introduced Negro History Week.
- In 1963, on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, Martin Luther King Jr. delivered one of the greatest speeches in American History. King seemed to sense the historic importance of the moment as he opened his "I Have a Dream" speech during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom (the greatest demonstration for freedom in the history of our nation). He worked for change through non-violent action.
- In 1976, as part of America's bicentennial celebration, the week was extended to a month and officially became known as Black **History Month**
- Frederick Douglass, 1800's was a highly regarded leader in American Civil Rights He was a reformer, orator, writer and statesman. After escaping from slavery, he became a leader of the abolitionist movement, gaining note for his dazzling oratory and incisive antislavery writing.

Chili Cheese Dip Recipe

A Super Bowl Appetizer from tasteofhome.com 1 pound lean ground beef 1 cup chopped onion 1 can (16 oz) kidney beans, drained and rinsed 1 can (15 oz) black beans, rinsed and drained 1 can (14 1/2 oz) diced tomatoes in sauce 1 cup frozen corn 3/4 cup water 1 can (2 1/4 oz) sliced ripe olives, drained 3 teaspoons chili powder 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano 1/2 teaspoon chipotle hot pepper sauce 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin 1 package (16 oz) Velveeta, cubed **Corn Chips**

Directions:

- In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Transfer to a 5 quart slow cooker. Stir in the beans, tomatoes, corn, water, olives, chili powder, oregano, pepper sauce, garlic powder and cumin.
- Cover and cook on low for 4-5 hours or until heated through; stir in cheese. Cover and cook for 30 minutes or until cheese is melted. Serve with corn chips. Yield: 8 cups


