- Moving Forward
 - Teachers have spent time reviewing data specifically looking at *Evidence Based Statements*. This data provided information on what type of questions and standards were part of the IAR and the percentage of students who were able to answer the question successfully. They are taking this information and making adjustments to their Curriculum Maps this year. In addition, they began discussions with their content teams on ways to fill in the gaps.
 - Two content areas have new textbooks this year. The science and math teams are meeting regularly to align, plan, and implement these new resources.
 - The ELA team is developing a school-wide writing assessment framework. Their goal is for every student to be able to develop a well-written five-paragraph essay by the end of their 8th grade year.
