B. City of Aledo Sidewalk Grant Project

The City of Aledo has notified the District of their success in securing grant funding through the Texas Department of Transportation for sidewalks. These walkways run from the crosswalk in front of Ciera Bank to the crosswalk in front of McAnally Intermediate.

We are excited about these safety improvements for our students and look forward to assisting the City of Aledo in any way possible to make this happen.

The work is planned for this summer with an eye towards completion before the school year begins in 2016-17.

C. Update - AISD/Walsh Ranch MOU

District staff and representatives from the Walsh Development have been working toward completing a Memorandum-of-Understanding between the District and the development. Trustees will begin work on this document tonight in closed session with possible deliberation and vote coming after the executive session has ended.

The purpose of the MOU is to make sure the District's interests are protected as we go forward with a possible recommendation to build Elementary #5 in Walsh.

D. Update - Elementary Playground Projects

All four elementary playground upgrades are nearing completion. As Trustees will remember this effort was a joint project between the District and the Aledo Education Foundation.

The contractor hired for this project began with the McCall playground so that the two young ladies who began this endeavor could use the playgrounds before they moved on to the fifth grade.
