Types of Services provided when School Health Services are listed in an IEP

- 1. Observe students for changes in physical or mental status, behavior or mood
- 2. Assist, supervise or do procedure to monitor blood sugar
- 3. Assist, supervise or administer Insulin
- 4. Assist, supervise or perform carbohydrate counts for meals, snacks
- 5. Administer, observe and monitor student for effects of medication
- 6. Allow student to rest if pain or fatigue is associated with the health condition
- 7. Monitor height, weight, BMI or vital signs
- 8. Train faculty and staff in emergency procedures based on student needs
- 9. After written parent permission is obtained-provide age and grade appropriate information regarding a student's condition and limitations
- 10. Teach signs and symptoms of allergic response to faculty and staff
- 11. Teach signs and symptoms of anaphylactic response
- 12. Teach staff to administer medication or Epi-Pen
- 13. Provide Teacher and Staff with copies of the Emergency Care and Emergency Evacuation Plans for all students who have an ECP and EEP
- 14. Notify parent or guardian to allow adequate time to obtain a refill for medication
- 15. Assist teachers and administrators to identify all objects that potentially contain latex and assist with identifying "safe" alternative products
- 16. Suction student as ordered or indicated
- 17. Monitor student for signs of VP shunt malfunction- headache, nausea, vision disturbance, mood or behavior changes
- 18. Observe students for signs of fatigue or activity intolerance
- 19. Catheterize student as ordered
- 20. Administer gastric feedings as ordered
