Family and Community Involvement <p>Reflects perceptions of families' and community members' degree of involvement in their school. High Expectations <p>Student perceptions of their own academic expectations as well as those of adults in their school and community. Peer Climate <p>Student Survey: Students' perceptions of how respectful and helpful students are to one another. Staff Survey: Staff perceptions of how respectful and helpful students are to one another, and towards their teachers. Prior to 2016, the staff scale was called Respectful Climate. Respectful Climate <p>Student perceptions of the fairness of rules and the respectful relationships between students and staff. Higher scores are better because they reflect more favorable perceptions of respectful climate. 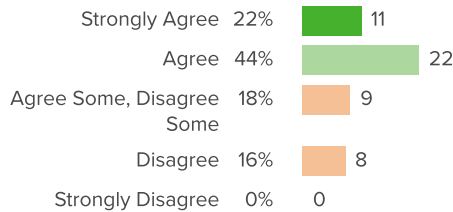

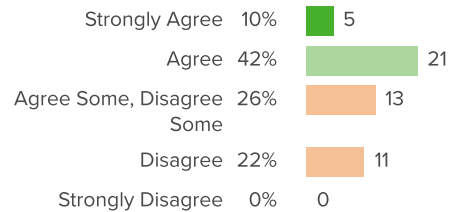

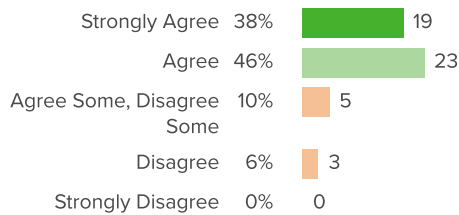

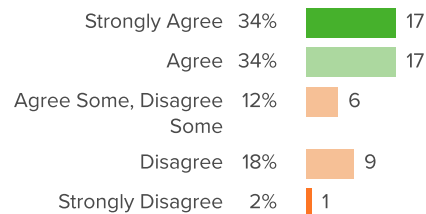

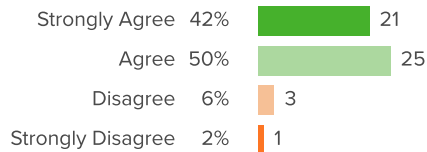

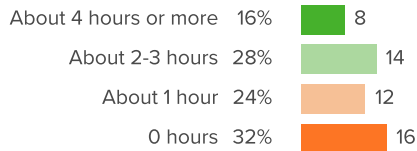

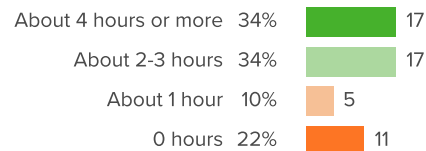

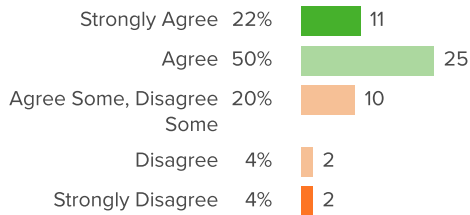

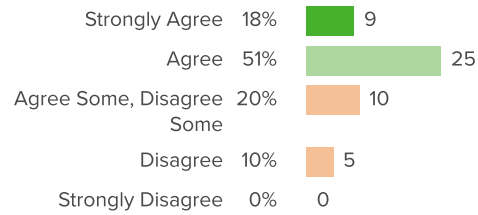

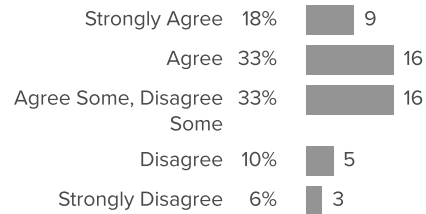

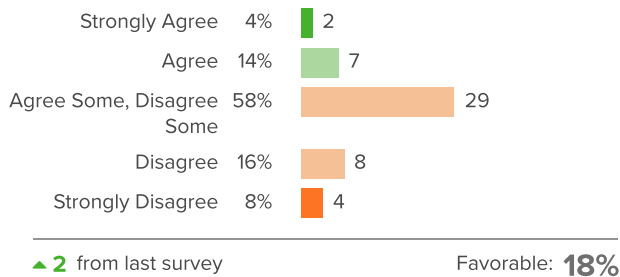

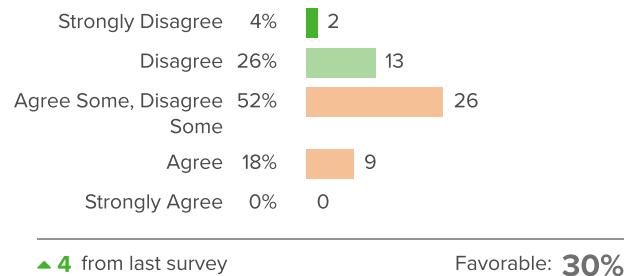

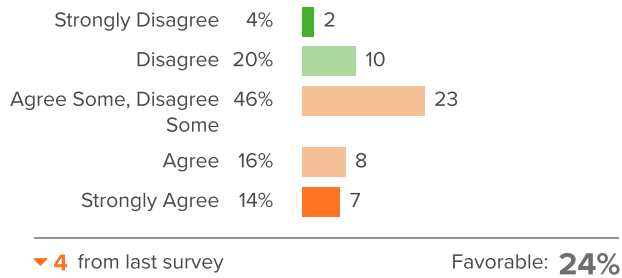

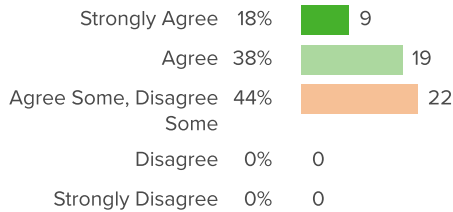

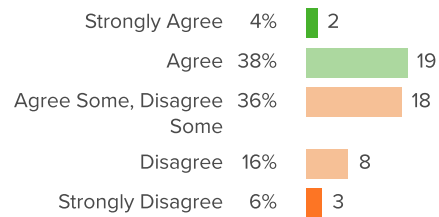

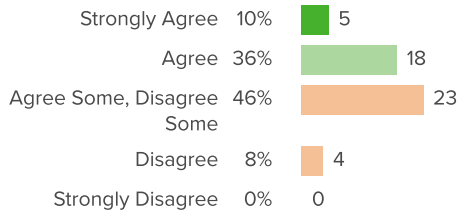

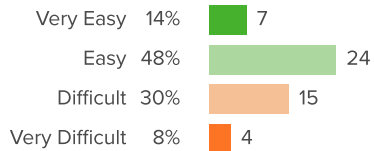

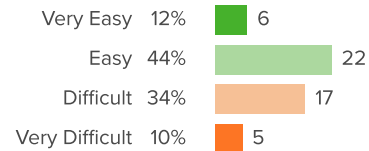

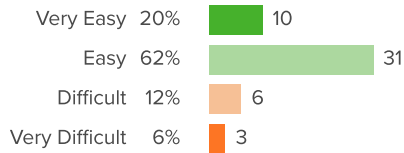

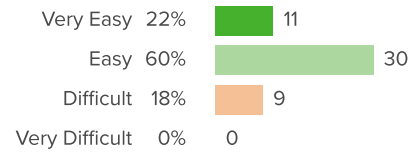

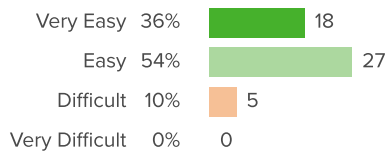

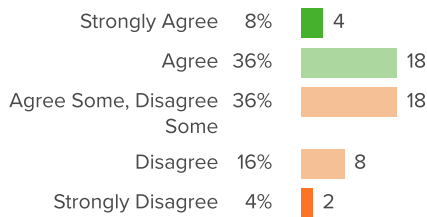

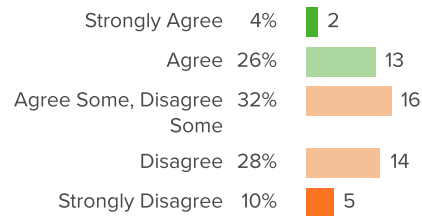

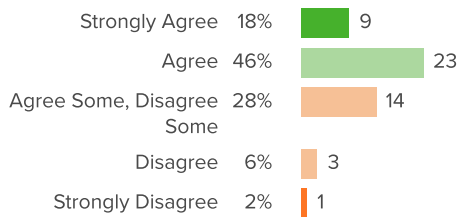

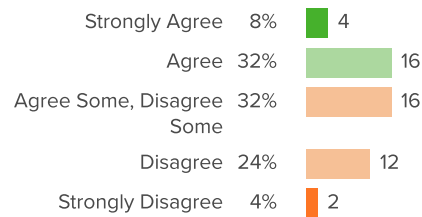

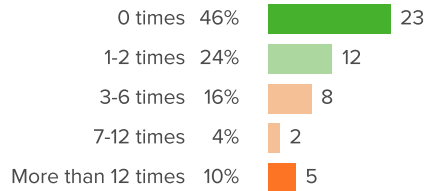

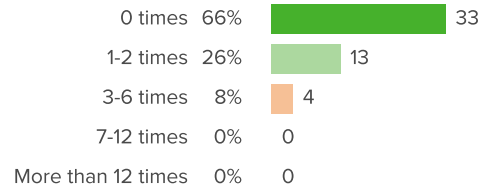

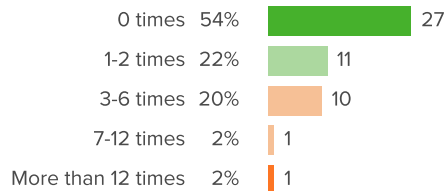

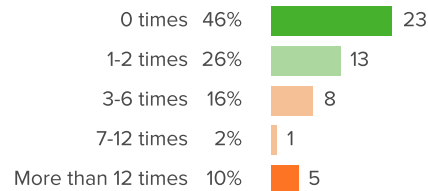

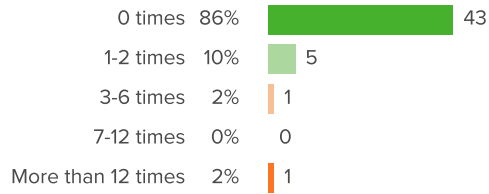

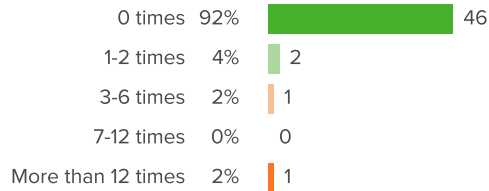

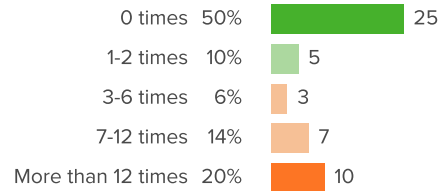

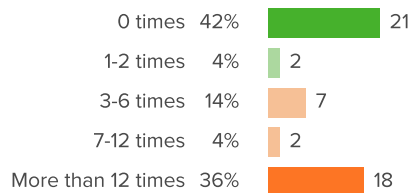

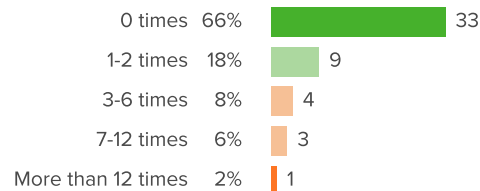
