#### YOUR STUDENT'S PROGRESS

Progress reports were mailed home and conferences were held last week. We had 48% of our students represented at conferences by parents. If you did not receive a report card and a conference invitation, please call the school so that you can make sure we have the correct mailing address in our system.

If you were not able to make it to conferences and have concerns about your student's grades, it is important that you communicate with the teachers. There are a variety of ways to do that:

- Cell phone numbers for teachers are on page 11 of this newsletter.
- If you have internet access, go to www.threerivers.k12.or.us and click on Illinois Valley schools, Illinois Valley High School, and then staff directory (lower left hand side). All teachers' emails can be accessed from there. Teachers will respond to emails and cell phone messages within 24 hours during the school week.
- If you can get internet access, enroll in Parent Assist.
   This allows you to have access to your student's grades and attendance and other records on a daily or weekly basis. Teachers will upgrade student grades at least weekly. If you have not registered for Parent Assist, drop by the office and fill out the form. This must be done in person.

If you have registered for Parent Assist and are having trouble getting on, call Janie Pope at the school. Ms. Pope can trouble shoot issues with you.

## **Homecoming Week**

Homecoming is the week of November 1st—5th. The Homecoming football game is Friday night, the 5th. The dance will be held on November the 6th.

We would love to see as many people as possible out supporting our athletes at the game and at the parade.

The Homecoming Parade is set for Friday afternoon, November the 5th. If you would like to come and support our students, we would appreciate it. The Marching Band will be in the parade and each class represented by a float and all the students in the class. The parade will go down River St to Evergreen School, up Lister, and then by LBMS. It will leave IV between 12:45 and 1:00. Be on the route and cheer for our kids.

# IVHS made AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress)

No Child Left Behind (NCLB) is the federal government's plan to make sure that all students become proficient readers and math students by the year 2014. Schools who meet the standards set by government are said to have made Adequate Yearly Progress or AYP. Though the laws are comprehensive and complicated the essence of NCLB is:

- All students (100%) will reach high standards, at a minimum attaining proficiency or better in reading and mathematics by 2013-2014.
- ♦ By 2013-2014, all students will be proficient in reading by the end of the third grade.
- All limited English proficient students will become proficient in English.
- All students will be taught by highly qualified teachers.
- All students will be educated in learning environments that are safe, drug free and conducive to learning.
- ♦ All students will graduate from high school.

We are pleased that IVHS met the criteria and made AYP again for school year 2009–2010. The testing scores for reading and math were based on last year's sophomore class.

For the eight years that AYP has been calculated, IVHS has made it seven times. We are very proud of this accomplishment.

The standards go up this year with 70% of the students required for reading and 69% required for math. We are working hard to help our students achieve to this standard.

# **Anti-Bullying**

Illinois Valley High School is continuing to work on making IV safe for all students. We are once again focusing on Anti-Bullying. We are working on educating students on what bullying is and how to protect themselves and stand up for other students. Students in the PRIDE class and in the Leadership class are helping to get the message out to students.

If your student is reporting to you that he or she is being bullied at school, please encourage him or her to come and talk with an administrator or the counselor. We also welcome hearing from parents. Taking a stand against bullying behaviors is the first step to stopping it.

# **Get your Student ID Card Validated:**

Students, you can pay \$10.00 to get their student body card validated. This will allow them free entrance to nearly all volleyball, football and basketball home games. It is a **very good value**, since regular admission is \$3.00 per game. See Mrs. Hall in the office.

## **Attention Seniors and Parents:**

Senior Class Safe and Sober Grad Night meets the second Wednesday of every month at the high school. It is for all graduating seniors. A letter will be sent out informing all parents of what is expected of them and their graduating senior. If you are a senior parent, get involved with this group. They need the help. It is difficult when a few parents are taking on the responsibility of providing this great night for all the seniors.

#### AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING AND HOMEWORK HELP

One of the things that our 21st Century grant funding allows us to do is run an after school tutoring / homework help program. We have budgeted this year to run it four nights a week: Monday—Thursday. After school tutoring will run from 3:40 until 5:40. The buses will leave the school at 5:45 PM.

Any student who is in an after-school activity may ride the activity bus. Students who are staying for after-school tutoring and who are riding the bus are expected to stay in the classroom the entire time. Students who are walking, being picked up, or driving themselves may leave when they are finished working. Students may not leave the campus and return later. Students are given a 15 minute break and a sack "dinner" about 4:30. There is no cost for this meal. No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport.

Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance. Many students could benefit from this extra help, so encourage your students to attend if they need the help.

The computer lab is open every night between 3:30 and 4:30 for student use.



#### **October is Breast Cancer Awareness**

With October being Breast Cancer Awareness month, the Illinois Valley High School Football team helped out. October 8th was a special game where all proceeds from the team's program sales went to help fight breast cancer. CURVES was at the game selling pink ribbons and baked goods. The football team wore pink ribbons on their helmets and the cheerleaders were attired in pink. Students and fans also wore pink to the game instead of the normal red and white. Thank you to everyone for making this event special!

## **DRESS CODE**

We would appreciate the help of parents in monitoring their student's attire for school. Students are asked to come dressed for school in a reasonably modest manner. Our primary mission is education and intellectual development. Students are asked to wear clothing that contributes to a positive school climate and does not distract from our mission. Bizarre, immodest or revealing clothing demeans the value of the wearer and disrupts the educational atmosphere which cannot be permitted.

It is important that students understand that different situations require us to modify the clothes we wear. For example, what is perfectly appropriate at the beach or a day on the river may not be appropriate for church, school or work.

While most students are doing a great job of dressing for the school environment, the biggest problems we have are:

- Shorts, skirts, and dresses that are too short.
   Shorts and skirts must be at mid-thigh. Mid—thigh is halfway between the top of your leg and the top of your knee.
- Blouses, shirts, tank tops that are too low cut. If cleavage is visible, the top is too low. We ask students to layer clothing as needed to make sure the breast area is covered.

- SKIN brand clothing that depicts the silhouette of a naked woman. This type of clothing is an example of clothing that demeans a gender.
- Shirts that advertise alcohol or alcohol brands.
- Pajama bottoms and slippers. Students are allowed to wear sweat pants, but not pajama pants.

When a student is not appropriately dressed for school, they will be reminded of the rules by staff members, asked to change clothing, and will receive a citation. Students who continue to fail to respond to the rules will be given consequences, up to and including suspension.

We do have some clean used clothing at the school that students will be given if needed.

Clothing choice is a very personal issue. We know that students (and adults) like to express their personalities through their wardrobes. We encourage students to do that within the guidelines of the dress code. There is lots of room in the dress code for free expression of one's personality.

## FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH

All students must reapply for free or reduced lunch status in order to receive that help with purchasing breakfast and lunch. Until the Free and Reduced applications have been turned in and cleared by food service, students must pay for their lunches. Please make sure you have filled those out on one of the enrollment dates. The sooner we get them in, the sooner students can get approved.

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# Program at Illinois Valley High School To Help Homeless Students and Families

Dear Parents/Guardians,

I am Heather Merrill, the Family Advocate for Illinois Valley High School. The purpose of the Family Advocate is to help students overcome barriers to success. I will help students acquire jackets, clothes, school supplies, hygiene supplies, glasses, dental appointments, haircuts, etc. I will also advocate for students: For example: helping them get testing or counseling, acquiring birth certificates, arranging for extra tutoring and other related services.

In addition, there is a federal law called the **McKinney-Vento**, which gives additional assistance to students that meet the federal definition of "homeless". Examples of "homeless" under the federal definition include:

- Living in a home with no heat or running water
- Staying with friends or other relatives because they lack housing choices
- Fleeing a domestic violence situation
- Living in a car, van, bus, tent, or other non-permanent structure
- Living in one of the above situations may also entitle a student to: Transportation to their home school should homelessness require a move
- Immediate enrollment, even if there are issues, such as not having in hand:
- O A birth certificate(s) for the child(ren)


