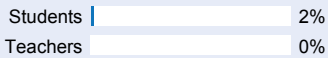

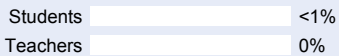

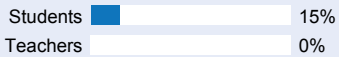

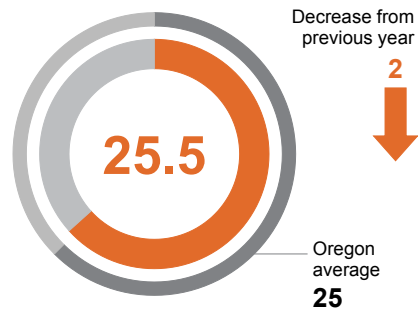

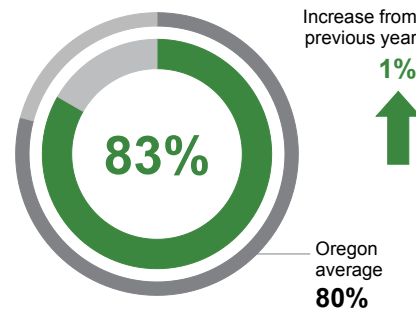
CLASS SIZE

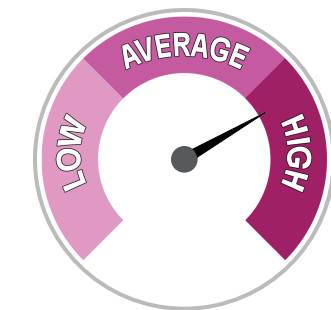
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

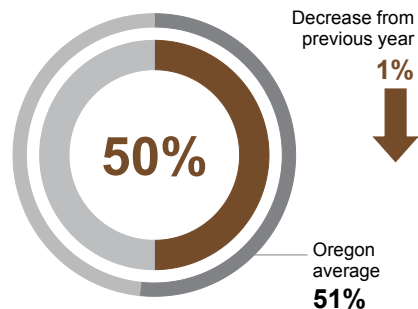
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

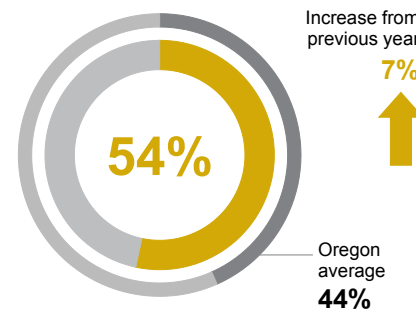
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



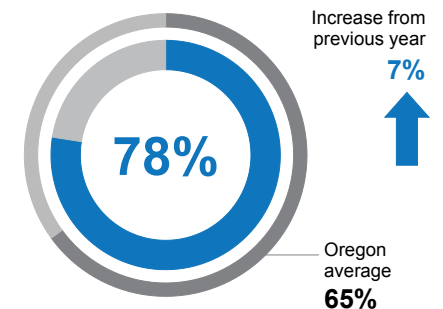
MATHEMATICS

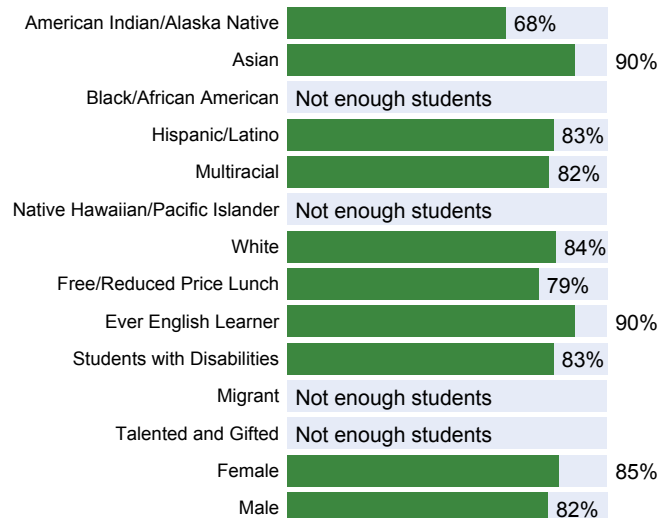

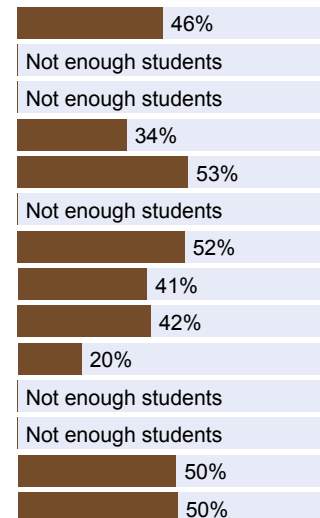

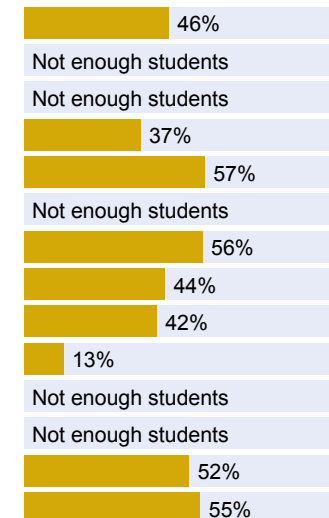

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all of our students, our school child development specialist provides lessons to students and staff about recognizing, addressing, and preventing bullying and harassment behavior. We also have the SafeOregon anonymous reporting line/email available to students and parents which can be found on our school website. We have an annual character education assembly which also addresses bullying and harassment prevention for our school. Our staff continually work with students and parents on a case-by-case basis to address conflict between students and to provide counseling to learn how to respectfully treat others.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our school offers several extracurricular activities:

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Our school strives to engage all of our parents by providing language supports for parents where English is their second language.

Our school has a parent club, in which parents can be involved as much as they wish. Some parents are very active, and some simply volunteer for one event or activity.

We also have many parent volunteers who assist teachers in their classrooms on a daily basis.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We partner with the local community to provide students with learning opportunities:
