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# HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

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- The 2019 legislation: AB168 mandated restorative justice practices for all public schools in Nevada, requiring schools to use non-punitive interventions before resorting to suspension or expulsion.
- In 2023, AB330 and AB285 revised the state's approach to restorative practices. The new laws shifted to a more "progressive discipline plan approach" that embraced restorative practices in addition to other methods, including alternative conflict resolution and social-emotional learning.

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# WHAT IS RESTORATIVE DISCIPLINE?

- Philosophy focusing on building community and repairing harm.

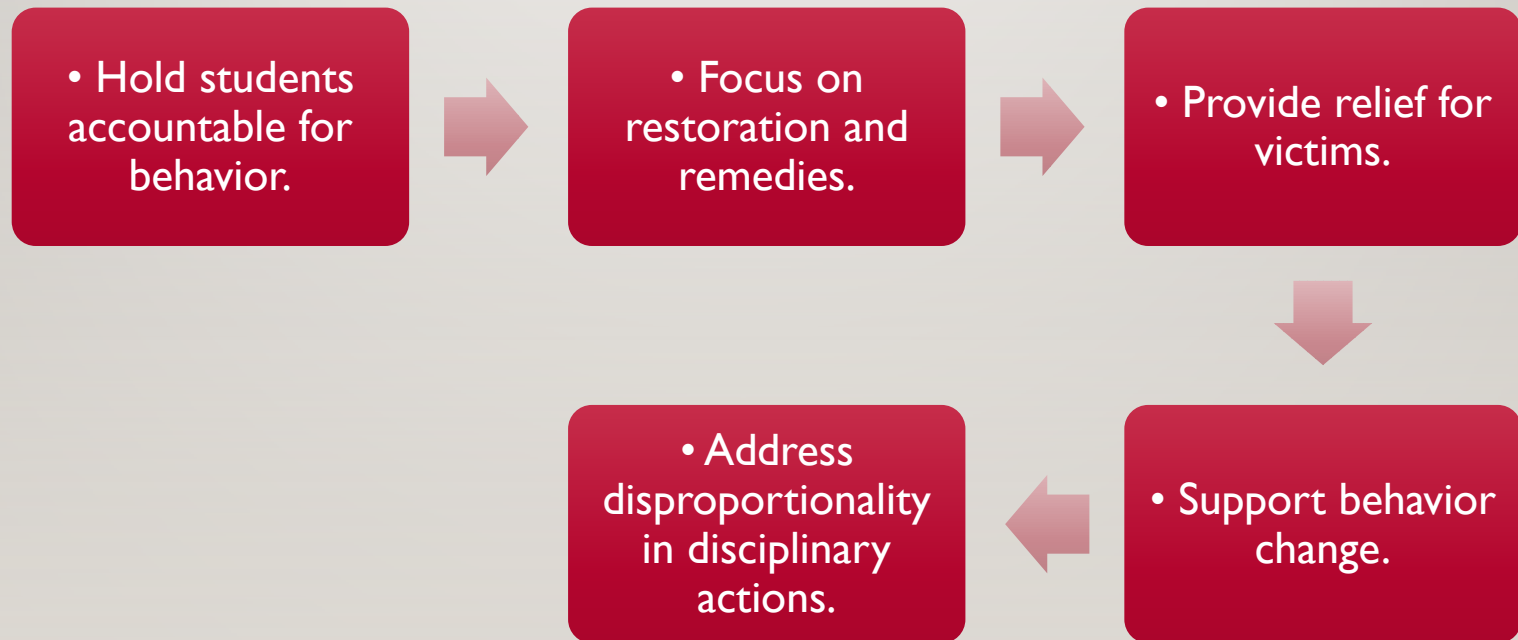
- Adds alternatives to punitive measures.

- Encourages dialogue, empathy, and accountability.

- Seeks to prevent recurrence of harm through understanding and collaboration.

# RESTORATIVE DISCIPLINARY PRACTICES

- • Developed with broad stakeholder input.
- • Consistent with written rules of behavior.
- • Includes provisions for conflict resolution & Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) interventions.
- • Provides for alternative placements when necessary.
- • Reviews disproportionality in suspensions/expulsions.
- • Posted publicly and accessible to schools.

# LCSD AS A LEADER FOR NEVADA

- • LCSD has been a front runner and model for restorative discipline in Nevada.
- • Plan aligns fully with Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) obligations.
- • Developed with input from 150+ stakeholders including parents, teachers, students, and administrators.

Submit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Nov 15: Submit progress report to Superintendent of Public Instruction.</li></ul>
