Board Policy 899: Naming of School District Facilities

How It Works

- Superintendent appoints a naming committee of up to 10 members
- Committee proposes 2–3 potential names
- Superintendent reviews and makes a recommendation to the School Board
- School Board approves the final facility name

Committee Representation Considerations

- Parent or community representative(s)
- School or program administrator(s)
- Teacher or staff member(s)
- City or business community representative
- Resident with local or historical knowledge

Naming Categories

- Distinguished individuals (education, science, public service)
- Geographic area served by the school
- Significant local, state, or national events



Facility Background

- On April 8th voters approved the building of a \$15 million multipurpose athletic facility for Apollo, Tech, Crush and community use.
- This is an indoor turf facility that gives access to play soccer, softball, lacrosse and practice baseball, football and golf. It also houses batting cages and golf simulators.

Naming Committee Recommendation: Option 1

APEX Athletics Complex

The word APEX reflects both the physical height of the facility and the goal of reaching the peak of athletic training and achievement. The name inspires students to strive for their highest potential while positioning the facility as a premier location for sports and training.



Naming Committee Recommendation: Option 2

APEX 742 Athletic Training Facility

This option builds on the APEX theme from option one while incorporating 742, connecting the facility directly to our school district. It symbolizes district pride, unity and the goal of all students reaching the pinnacle of athletic development.



Naming Committee Recommendation: Option 3

ACT Athletic Center

This acronym brings together Apollo, Crush and Tech and ties our school communities together by using the first letter from each to create ACT acronym.
