What conditions do WE control?

The Focus Principle Focus on what students should know and be able to do successfully. The focus of a school includes clearly defined performance standards across the disciplines and through the grade levels.

- **The Alignment Principle** Align all programs, practices, procedures, and policies to what we want ALL students to know and be able to do.
- **The Expectations Principle** Expectations are high for ALL stakeholders (students, teachers, administrators, staff, and parents). What we expect, align, and allocate time to is "what we will get."
- **The Opportunity Principle** Opportunity for ALL stakeholders (students, teachers, administrators, staff, and parents) at their highest potential is ensured by schools and districts that provide increased time, duration, frequency, and access to research-based strategies known to increase achievement.
