- Stemmed from initiatives such as Character Counts and PBIS (Positive Behavior Incentive Supports)
- Those programs dissolved and we still felt the need for building culture and climate.
- Past projects included: collection of gifts and free holiday trees for families of cancer patients and children in foster care, clothing collections, gloves/mitten donations, etc.

Where we are now:

- Our committee (6-7 people) meet once a month to plan and organize lessons around
 cultural awareness for our staff to use with our students (ie-Too Good for Drugs, Diwali, Veteran's Day, 911, Black History Month, Women's History Month, etc.)
- Plan assemblies, spirit weeks, celebrations, and other school-wide events
- Events that we have organized: clothing collections, food collections, Feed My Starving Children outings, themes for each school year, assemblies, school-wide awareness campaigns, cultural events, Red Ribbon Week events, Spirit Weeks, etc.
- Also, organize staff events that foster a positive climate and culture within our school.
